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Our Superior Success Story

Gwendolyn Peyton

"Superior Care saved my life!"

Our latest success story is about how quality rehabilitation is truly life-changing. Paducah native and Tilghman graduate, Gwendolyn Peyton, is our December Success Story. Ms. Peyton came to Superior after complications from COPD and heart issues, and



she wanted to regain strength and increase her mobility. "My quality of life has improved 1,000%!" Ms. Peyton exclaimed. "My three children have told me that I am my old self again! The people here are so loving, and everything is so clean! And, with the help of Nicole, the dietician, I have been able to manage my diabetes with just my diet!"

Upon admission, Ms. Peyton had very low tolerance for activity, 1-2 minutes with impaired balance and scoring 13/28 on the Tinetti test. She could walk only a limited distance, about 5 feet with a walker, and needed assistance to transfer from bed to chair.

Upon discharge, Ms. Peyton's balance has greatly improved from 13/28 to 24/28, considerably lowering her risk of falling. Her activity tolerance has also improved from 1-2 minutes to 25 minutes. Her transfers are independent from all surfaces, and she can walk 150 feet with a walker and negotiate 4 steps. Ms. Peyton's attitude and not giving up spirit have helped her with her outstanding rehabilitation.
