National Visa and Immigration Agencies have stepped up enforcement.

With mounting parliamentary, media and international pressure acting as change agents, agencies are stepping up the number of inspections both domestically and around the world in satellite and franchise campuses. In addition, they are working more closely with other International Agencies to coordinate and share enforcement activities.

With the increased activity, agencies are finding that the Visa and Immigration compliance gap has grown as evidenced by recent activity in the United Kingdom. The results are dramatic with an increase in licence suspensions, spot checks, and warning letters. They are more detailed, include more elements and the findings often involve a deep dive into every aspect of the recruitment and management of the international student cohort with coordinated warning letters that spread across Recruitment and Registration, Student Services, Course Delivery right to Finance and the University Secretary Function.

The resulting actions have associated remediation costs. In some cases, it results in licence suspension, termination of registrations, or loss of licence – all with even more costly consequences.

The internationalisation of Higher Education has picked up significant speed in the last few years, this has been happening in tandem with large scale expansion of the franchise sector, language feeder schools and other third-party providers. Also, they have seen the evolution of best practices, leading to a heightened awareness and expectations as to the level of compliance evidenced within institutional systems and processes.

Visa and Immigration Compliance Hot Buttons

In examining recent feedback on spot checks, audits and warning letters and feedback, a pattern emerges of what visa and immigration audits are emphasising. These are the top compliance trends seen most frequently:

Systems and Process Approach - Visa and immigration agencies are reviewing systems and processes and their findings and audit reports reflect this shift. There is an emerging requirement for evidence of an auditable system of attendance and engagement with their studies by international student cohorts.

Standardisation across Departments & Institutions - Visa & Immigration Enforcement Agencies are holding institutions accountable to standardisation and demanding consistency.

Proper Use of Risk Based Approaches - Adoption of best practice had led to the adoption of a formal risk register based approach and the use of risk-based approaches that are based on sound management information supported by evidence-able data.

Management of Change Control - One of the most frequently cited visa and immigration excursions is poor management of change.

Corrective Action/ Preventive Action (CAPA) - One of the first places that compliance officers typically review; Identification of previous issues and evidence of corrective action are standard operating procedure for any audit.

While most of these Visa and Immigration trends are broad and systemic in nature, their influence on the operation of institutions, their international recruitment activity and the institutional risk register is significant.

From maintaining a validated data state and to reporting tolerance breaches, these areas require new approaches to drive compliance without substantial increases in costs.

Student Technology Drivers

21st technology platforms offering advanced analytics, reporting, workflow capabilities present new options for driving student success and automating visa and immigration compliance in education. Progressive HEI's and FEI's are embracing this new functionality to ensure they can deliver on student success as well as visa and immigration compliance:

Benefits of New Student Success Technology

Major benefits of implementing compliance solutions with this updated technology include:

Improved Quality - Improving student outcomes quality, whether through holding tighter tolerances, reducing attrition, improving results or student satisfaction will improve reputation and revenue and ensures greater market share of prospective students. By keeping early warning systems ahead of compliance requirements, international student compliance and retention increase and compliance costs and loss of fees are significantly

Prepare for Brexit

Visa restrictions and higher fees for EU (non-UK) student's due to their changing status will increase the UKVI compliance workload and associated risks.
