
How to Make a Mini Book


1. Print out as many mini books you wish to make.




- 2. Using gray lines as a guide, fold page in half matching long edges, print side up. Open up again.
- 3. Fold page in half matching short sides, print side up. Leave folded.
- 4. Fold each short side back towards the spine of the middle fold created in step 3 to end up with an accordion folded page.










7. Lay the page on table with cut edge up and folds made in step 4 out to form a tent.



8. Grab each side of the folds cut edge, push down and bring sides together. (You with have what looks like an "X") Close up the book so that the title page is in the front.
