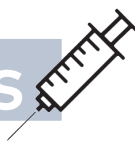

HYPOSENSITIZATION

ALLERGY INJECTIONS



- Every other day initially & eventually once per month
- Treat up to 20 allergens per set
- Initial set lasts 283 days
- Most economical option
- Observe cat for 45 minutes after each dose

ALLERGY DROPS



- Once a day oral administration (No food/drink 10 minutes before/after)
- Treat up to 20 allergens per set
- Initial set lasts 100 days or 150 days
- 2 pumps or 3 pumps (based on weight)

ENTRY POINTS

COMMON MOLD & INDOOR ALLERGENS

**Most abundant molds worldwide*

CLADOSPORIUM

Grows on plants, leather, rubber, cloth, paper, & wood

FUSARIUM

A major parasite of rice; found in sugar cane, sorghum, root rot, & maize grains

CANDIDA ALBICANS

Found in soil, organic debris, & in humans as an organism in the nasal cavity & feces

NIGROSPORA

Most commonly found as a plant parasite in grains & grass

ASPERGILLUS

Found in soil, damp hay, grain, & fruit

ORRIS ROOT

Violet scented fragrance; found in potpourri & certain cosmetics

SISAL

Used in rope/twine, paper, cloth, wall coverings, & carpets

STEMPHYLIUM

Isolated from dead plants, & cellulose material

PENICILLIUM

Grows in soil, decaying vegetation, breads, fruit, & cheese

SMUTS

Found on corn, grasses, weeds, flowering plants, & other fungi; wind disseminated

PULLULARIA

(Aureobasidium pullulans)
Isolated from grasses, seeds, honey comb, nests, fruit, leather, cotton fabrics, & concrete

CURVULARIA

May cause leaf spots & seedling blight; seen on castor beans, cotton, rice, barley, wheat, & corn

*Not to be confused with an allergy to the medication Penicillin

KAPOK

Found in furniture upholstery, pillows, & stuffed animals

PHOMA

Grows in damp/humid areas on paper products, soil, & dead plants

WOOL

Found in blankets, rugs, saddle cloths, carpeting, insulation, & upholstery

COTTON

Found in bedspreads, sheets, window shades, towels/washcloths, wall covers, & book bindings

PYRETHRUM

Used in certain insecticides & flea/tick collars

RHIZOPUS

Found in sand boxes, pine needles, leaves, bird nests/droppings, & decomposing bread, fruits, & vegetables

ALTERNARIA

Grows on carpets, textiles, soil, seeds, plants, & horizontal surfaces in water damaged buildings

HELMINTHOSPORIUM

Plant parasite found on cereals, grasses, sugar cane, soil, & textiles

COCKROACH

Concentrations are highest in kitchen areas; however, the allergen is detectable throughout the house. Includes the insects' secretions & feces

HOUSE DUST

Found in high humidity/damp areas on carpets, bare floors, furniture upholstery, pillows, mattresses, box springs, stuffed animals, & books; distributed through mites' waste

ALLERGY-PROOFING YOUR HOME

ANNUAL

<input type="checkbox"/>	Smoking	Make your home a non-smoking environment.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Home Foundation	Check for gaps, cracks, and leaks. Address with a waterproofing seal.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Carpet	Replace with wood, tile, or linoleum. Have carpets professionally cleaned to sanitize and remove allergens.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Extermination	Have your home serviced by professional exterminators.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Air Ducts	Have air ducts professionally cleaned.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Mold Inspection	Inspect the interior and exterior of your home for visible mold growth. If necessary, consult a professional mold removal service.

SEMI-ANNUAL

<input type="checkbox"/>	Windows & Doors	Check and seal all gaps and leaks. Ensure screens are properly installed. Keep windows closed on windy or humid days.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Insulation	Check for worn insulation; replace if necessary.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Plumbing	Maintain all faucets, pipes, and bathtubs. Inspect for leaks and seal them immediately.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Home Exterior	Treat foundation with fungicidal spray.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bedding	Clean mattress thoroughly. If possible, encase with allergy cover.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Laundry Room	Inspect washer and dryer connections for leaks. Ensure that dryer is venting to the outside.

MONTHLY

<input type="checkbox"/>	Air Filters	Inspect air conditioning and heating filters for cleanliness and to ensure proper installation. Check filters on air purifier units.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Landscape	Prune tree and shrub branches away from the home to prevent mold growth.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Hyposensitization	Be sure to give your cat their allergy treatment.

CHECKLIST:

ALLERGY-PROOFING YOUR HOME

WEEKLY

<input type="checkbox"/>	Dust Control	Use a static cloth or dust spray. Allow dust to settle for 20 minutes before vacuuming. Store items that gather dust in sealed boxes or display items in glass cases.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Vacuum	Thoroughly vacuum. Use a vacuum with a filter size of 5 microns or smaller to trap dust mites, mold spores, and pollen. Change filter frequently and never reuse filters.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Dehumidifier Maintenance	Clean filter and collection chamber with 10% bleach solution.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Laundry	Wash all bedding and stuffed toys in hot water. If available, run exhaust fan while laundering. Place washed items in hot dryer, never line-dry outside. Store washed materials immediately to avoid dust contamination.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Landscape	Avoid mowing lawns during the peak pollen production times of the early morning and evening.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Garbage	Have garbage removed weekly. Wash all garbage collection containers and spray with insecticide.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Bathroom & Kitchen	Clean visible mold with 10% bleach solution.
<input type="checkbox"/>	Dog	Bathe your dog regularly to remove dust, pollens and dander they may bring inside or if your cat reacted to dog dander.

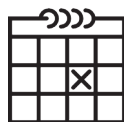

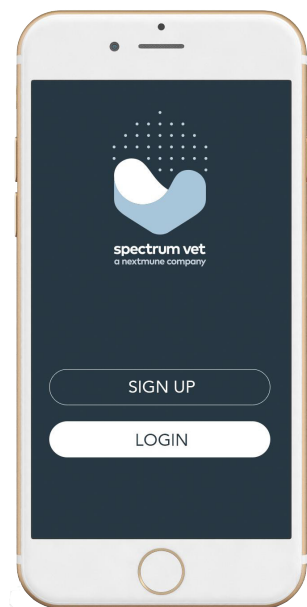

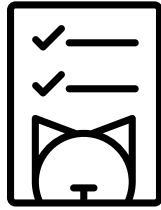

2. ORDER TREATMENT

Which option is best for you – injections or drops?

How long will they last?

Injections last 283 days and the oral drops last 100 days. Injections start out every other day and work up to once per month, whereas drops are once daily. They both can treat up to 20 allergens in a single set.



3. EXPECTATIONS

What is a "success"?

We consider a success the effective elimination (or significant reduction) of steroid or relief medications.

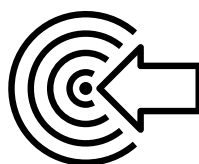
When should I see improvement?

Allergy treatment is a long-term process, but it is the only way to address the real reason a cat suffers. It can take up to 4-6 months before you see the therapy's benefits. Every cat responds differently.



4. WHY MAINTENANCE?

Allergy treatment is a solution that is usually required indefinitely, since allergies are a life-long problem. After symptoms subside, it is important to maintain the tolerance you've established. If you stop treatment, tolerance will fade, symptoms can re-emerge, and you'll have to start over.

When the results came back I was shocked at the sheer number of things he reacted to. There was little else to do so we changed his diet, based on the results, and ordered treatment.

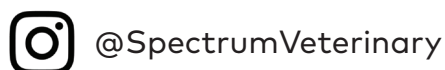
In just a few short weeks we were already seeing his situation improve. He continued to improve week after week until his symptoms were under control.
