Program Narrative:

Accountants are essential team members within large and small businesses, and at non-profits and educational institutions. With a degree in accounting, you will also have the knowledge you need to manage your own business. Northampton's Accounting program, which is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Business Schools and Programs (ACBSP), provides a solid foundation of specific accounting concepts as well as the skills you will need to succeed in the field.

There are several different options that students can pursue in the Accounting program at Northampton, including the Associate in Applied Science (AAS) or one of two Specialized Diplomas. On its own, Northampton's associate degree will qualify you for a range of employment opportunities, including entry-level accounting, bookkeeping, accounts payable or accounts receivable clerks and more. If your path is to pursue a career as a Certified Public Accountant (CPA) or Certified Management Accountant (CMA), an associate degree from Northampton is an affordable way to start down the path toward the required further education requirement.

The accelerated AAS degree program can be completed on the Bethlehem campus.

- Prepare financial reports and statements.
- Interpret financial data and financial information.
