This award honors an individual physical therapist who has given of themselves to society without thought of personal or professional gain.

### **Eligibility**

Recipient must be an active, active life, affiliate or affiliate life member in good standing of the APTA of Massachusetts for at least 5 years.

#### **Qualifications**

- 1. Must be a member of APTA for at least 5 years.
- 2. Must have demonstrated leadership ability
- 3. Support innovation in clinical and/or administration area
- 4. Demonstrate community involvement and service

#### **Method of Nomination**

- 1. Nominees must submit an application for the award
- 2. Must include 3 letters of reference addressing how the candidate meets or exceeds the established criteria

### Selection

- 1. The nomination committee will select one candidate annually and make its recommendation to the APTA of MA BoD.
