

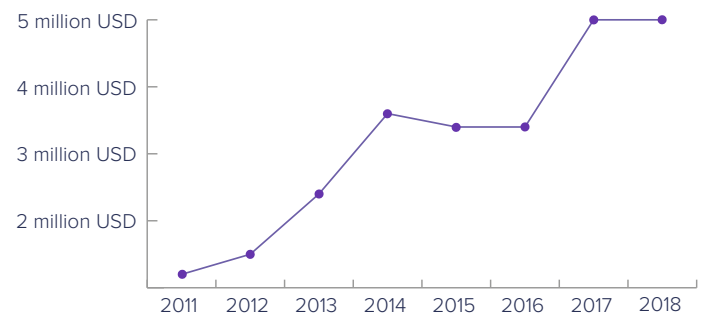

Every person should have access to information regarding options and should be able to decide freely at the end of their lives as to where and how they wish to die.

We believe palliative care should be available for all, and should be accepted as a natural part of life. And we have worked hard to see this happens: we've fostered financial self-sufficiency for selected Czech hospices through a fundraising academy, we've supported new approaches and ideas in organizations and facilities where people spend the end of their lives, we've financed new palliative care teams in many Czech hospitals, and we've introduced the development of palliative medicine as a subject in selected universities.

Start Together

Families of children with disabilities should have timely access to all necessary information and services so they can come to the best solutions sooner.

We support all parent groups and organizations who are supportive of these special needs families. We commissioned the first-ever Analysis of Early Care in the Czech Republic (2015). Using this information, we then were able to support the development of early intervention providers by creating a two-year leadership academy for their representatives. We've also supported projects headed by parent groups as well as the development of community services.

We consider a quality and modern education to be the most important factor in preparing children to lead the world of tomorrow. The foundation and company work together to support Avast's mission of cultivating the next generation of cybersecurity experts and educating people how to stay safe online.

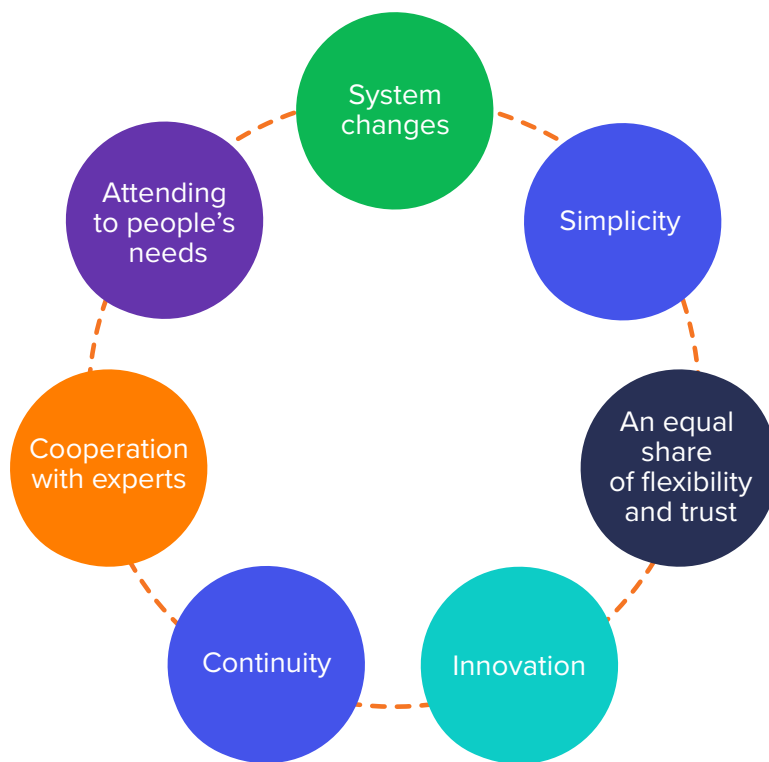
