SXSWedu 2019 presents a Panel Discussion to address Teaching Students How to Fail

The panel discussion will focus on how high school entrepreneurship programs are ideally suited to teach students how to "get to failure fast," a rallying cry among entrepreneurs but generally not educators. Entrepreneurs recognize that failures allow them to identify areas for improvement in their business model, and as such, are an essential component for success. Transferring this philosophy to the classroom is achieved by allowing students to work in teams to learn about all aspects of business as they create their own authentic business. Students learn to work through failure as an important part of the learning process, not the end. Furthermore, students learn critical life skills by utilizing a growth mindset that encourages creative problem-solving, collaboration, adaptability, communication and perseverance.

"Failure is perceived by most students and parents as a sign of weakness," said Margarita Geleske. "Entrepreneurship students learn how to embrace setbacks or failures, pivot, learn from their mistakes and move forward. This builds self-confidence and resilience, the very life skills that are essential for personal and professional growth and success."

The panel will discuss how to navigate school culture and dynamics to encourage students to work through failures and learn from those experiences.
