People living with disabilities are the largest minority group in the world.¹

In the United States...

- 1 in 5 Americans have a disability.²
- 2 million people are blind or unable to see.³
- 2 million people depend on a wheelchair for day-to-day tasks and mobility.²
- 7 million people experience difficulty hearing.³
- **19 million** people have trouble grasping things like a pencil.³

Worldwide

- 15% of the world's population experience some form of disability during their lifetime.⁴

Lesson Learned = Screen reader users listen faster than I do.

Don't auto scroll text.

Offer a stationary text transcript for every video.

- Studies show that some people who are deaf read at a slower pace than people who are not deaf.¹
- Adults over age 65 are more likely to be distracted while reading.²
- Glaucoma reduces reading speed.
 2% of adults over age 40 have glaucoma.³



Imagine these scenarios...

Seeking information about a health condition, maybe she was just diagnosed with gluten allergy. Or maybe her five-year-old daughter was just diagnosed with asthma.

She may be **worried** and **frightened**.

Looking for a new healthcare provider because she has a new health insurance plan.

• She may be **disappointed**.

In need of a tax attorney and may feel a sense of urgency.


 She may feel stressed and overwhelmed.



Strategies Your Organization Can Do to Promote Inclusivity

Promote Inclusivity: Research Strategy

- Surveys: Locate constituents to gather information about their needs
- Focus Groups: Enables conversations among constituents to uncover common themes or patterns
- Interviews: One-on-one discussions with a user to learn his/her perspective
- Usability Testing: shows how a user interacts with a website



Remember, sometimes we think we know what the user wants to do, only to find out that he carved out his own solution.

We want to give them that best solution.

Promote Inclusivity: Content Strategy

- Use terminology that is less likely to be misinterpreted or considered offensive
- Support multiple languages and accept multiple types of monetary currency
- Provide easy path for users who may be in a distressed emotional state and need to find content immediately

Managing life with a food allergy means reading packaged food labels—every time you purchase that food.

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The only way to prevent a food-allergy reaction is to avoid the problem food. But you can't know whether a food contains an allergen simply by looking at it.

Laws and regulations like the Food Allergen Labeling and Consumer Protection Act of 2004 (FALCPA) have made it easier for people with food allergies to identify problem foods and avoid them.



- Look at **search terms** in Google Analytics
 - Search terms visitors typed into the search box on your website
 - Search queries people entered into Google
 to get to your website
- Look at the paths visitors follow in Google Analytics
- Review Google **Trends** to find the top search terms people use
