Position Description: The project is related to our Legacy Wells program, and includes an intensive records and data review, the production of a database of historic documents related to the Legacy Wells Program, a summary report of clean-up activities through time by the military and contractors, and the creation of a strategy to deal with potential buried debris and orphan drums in the National Petroleum Reserve in Alaska (NPR-A). The successful candidate will be responsible for conducting an extensive literature review of both hard copy reports and documents available online to gather as much existing data as possible on past activities on individual Legacy Wells sites from as early as the 1940's. This information will be used to create both an annotated bibliography database, as well as a summary report detailing the history of cleanup at the sites. The intern will also be asked to research and conduct outreach regarding the best means and methods to address additional clean-up at the sites, with the end deliverable a strategy document that communicates various alternatives that could be implemented by the BLM.
