ITALY: VENICE, FLORENCE & ROME

Day 1: Board your flight to Italy.

Day 2: Venice

- Meet with your tour leader at Venice Marco Polo Airport.
- Enjoy a half-day guided walking tour of **Venice**, a series of more than 100 islands connected by canals and bridges.
- Visit the Bridge of Sighs, the Rialto Bridge, and Piazza San Marco with its iconic clock tower. Grab a table at a local café to sample Venetian pastries and snacks.

Day 3: Murano & Venice

- Board a vaporetto (waterbus) to the island of **Murano** to witness their famous glass-blowing process.
- Return to Venice for lunch. During free time in the afternoon, consider visiting the Peggy Guggenheim Museum, housed in an unfinished palazzo overlooking the Grand Canal.

Day 4: Florence

- Board your private motor coach and travel to Florence.
- Upon arrival, take a walking tour of the Tuscan city, still a center of Italian culture.
- Your excursion will take you to the Piazza della Repubblica, II Duomo, and the Piazza della Signoria. You'll walk across the Arno River at the Ponte Vecchio and head to the Pitti Palace.
- After lunch, explore the Galleria dell'Accademia, housing works by Tuscan masters like Botticelli and Perugino. Perhaps the most famous piece of art in the museum is Michelangelo's David.

Day 5: Florence & Sorrento

- Step into the **Uffizi Gallery** for a guided tour of the Renaissance palace.
- Visit any landmarks you may have missed, like the church of Santa Croce. Built in 1294, it houses Giotto's frescoes and the tombs of Michelangelo, Galileo, and Machiavelli.
- Visit Mercato Centrale, an open air market where you can bargain for leather, raffia, and other artisan products.
- At Firenze Santa Maria Novella station, board a train to Naples. Upon arrival, travel by private motor coach to Sorrento.

Day 6: Pompeii & Sorrento

- Take a guided tour of Pompeii, the infamous site of the Mount Vesuvius eruption in 79 AD, which decimated the city and its inhabitants in minutes.
- Travel to **Herculaneum**, where structures remain well-preserved and serve as a living classroom for groups interested in ancient Roman society.

Day 7: Rome

- Board your private motor coach and travel to Rome.
- Your first stop will be a tour of Vatican City, an independent state in the heart of Rome.
- Explore St. Peter's Basilica, a late Renaissance church that can hold nearly 60,000 people inside its intricately-decorated walls.
- The highlight of your tour will be the **Sistine Chapel**, with Michelangelo's masterful frescoes on the ceiling. Afterward, be sure to take a stroll through the Vatican gardens.
- Embark upon a walking tour of Rome's city center. Climb the Spanish Steps at Piazza di Spagna. Shop along Via Condotti and head to the Trevi Fountain, believed to hold mystical powers. Your tour ends at Piazza Navona near the Pantheon. Admire the Fountain of the Four Rivers, one of Bernini's Baroque masterpieces.

Day 8: Rome

- Take a guided tour of the Colosseum and the Roman Forum. The ancient elliptical amphitheater opened in 80 AD with 100 days of games and fights. Its massive stone structure gives a glimpse into ancient Roman life and illuminates Rome's long history.
- Take a short walk up **Palatine Hill** to look down on the **Forum**, the center of Roman Parliament, and the **Circus Maximus**, the most famous stadium for chariot-racing during ancient times.
- Enjoy free time to explore Rome. Walk the streets and take in the majestic landmarks at your own pace.

Day 9: Depart to the airport for your flight home.
