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SAMPLE ITINERARY

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Day 1:

- Meet your Tour Director and board your private motor coach.
- Travel to the **Destrehan Plantation**, an antebellum mansion built in the French Colonial style. Local citizens banded together to ensure the restoration and preservation of the house, which dates back to 1787.
- After lunch, discover local ecology on a Cajun Pride Swamp Tour. This wild adventure is located only 25 minutes from the city in the Manchac swamp, where the bayous are teeming with wildlife and exotic plants.
- Discover the city's darker side learning about voodoo, zombies, vampires, and other haunting phenomena on a **Ghost City Tour**.

Day 2:

- Begin your day at the National WWII Museum, which tells the story of "the war that changed the world" from the perspective of the American experience.
- Get a behind-the-scenes look at New Orleans' most iconic tradition at Mardi Gras World. Watch artists build floats, learn the history of the parade, try on festive costumes, and even sample the city's famous King Cake.
- Visit the New Orleans Jazz National Historical Park in the illustrious Tremé neighborhood near the French Quarter. The park was established in 1994 as a way to document and celebrate the origins and contributions of jazz music and musicians. The site even houses a performance venue.
- Enjoy a dinner and jazz cruise on the Mississippi River aboard the **Steamboat Natchez**.

Day 3:

- Spend your morning in the historic **French Quarter**, the city's oldest neighborhood, and learn about the different cultures that gave the city its distinct identity.
- Walk through Jackson Square, stopping at St. Louis Cathedral and The Presbytère, and visit the French Market.
- Enjoy free time for lunch don't forget to try traditional beignets at a local café!
- Tour the New Orleans Mint, which operated as a branch of the U.S. Mint from 1838 to 1861, and again from 1879 to 1909.
- Explore **Frenchmen Street**, a hub for great music, local cuisine, and layers of urban culture.
- Take in a live jazz show during dinner at The Maison.

Day 4:

- Discover the city's **Garden District**, a collection of some of the best-preserved historic mansions in the south. You can spot the St. Charles Streetcar (still in operation) as you walk past diverse homes and gardens.
- Take a tour of Lafayette Cemetery and its ornate tombs dating back to the 1800s.
- Walk through **Tulane University** as you make your way to **Audobon Park**. The park's ancient oaks make it an ideal spot for picnics. It also features a zoo, an aquarium, an insectarium, and a nature center.
- Depart for home.
