TORONTO

Day 1:

- Meet your Tour Director and board your private motor coach.
- Tour **Casa Loma**, a Gothic Revival mansion that serves as a historic museum. Now a local landmark, it took three years (and 300 men) to build the 200,000 square foot castle in the early 1900s. The house features intricate decorations, five acres of gardens, and a series of underground tunnels connecting the estate.
- Experience hockey at its best at the **Hockey Hall of Fame**! The home of the Stanley Cup offers an interactive journey through Canada's favorite sport. Go up against life-size animations of today's greatest players, become a play-by-play announcer, view priceless memorabilia, and watch hockey's first 3D film.
- Head to the top of the **CN Tower**. The world's 9th tallest freestanding structure, standing over 1,800 feet tall, was named one of the Seven Wonders of the Modern World by the American Society of Civil Engineers. The Toronto skyline icon features glass elevators offering views of the city as you reach the Glass Floor, the Outdoor Observation Terrace, and the Indoor Lookout Level.

Day 2:

- Travel to Niagara Falls, three waterfalls that line the border between Ontario in Canada and New York in the United States. Horseshoe Falls, American Falls, and Bridal Veil Falls range between 70 to 188 feet high and offer stunning views of the Niagara River as it heads toward Lake Ontario. During peak hours, more than six million cubic feet of water rumble over the crest of the falls each minute.
- Hop aboard the Maid of the Mist. Your boat tour will take you on a roaring adventure down the Niagara River, past the American and Bridal Veil Falls and into the mist of Horseshoe Falls.
- Enjoy lunch in Clifton Hill.
- Journey Behind the Falls as you descend 125 feet into 130-year-old tunnels. You'll hear the thunderous Horseshoe Falls well before you step out onto the observation deck at the foot of the falls. The experience offers a unique view as onefifth of the world's fresh water crashes down before your eyes.

Day 3:

- Go under the sea at **Ripley's Aquarium of Canada**, home of North America's longest underwater viewing tunnel, with almost six million liters of water and more than 100 interactive opportunities. Meet horseshoe crabs, sharks, and stingrays at a touch exhibit, and be sure to catch a live dive show during your visit. The aquarium's nine galleries let you view fresh and saltwater habitats from around the world, including species from the nearby Great Lakes Basin.
- Explore Kensington Market and Chinatown. Two of the most culturally diverse areas of Toronto, these colorful side-by-side neighborhoods are full of street-side vendors and vintage clothing shops.
- Tour **Rogers Centre**, home of the Toronto Blue Jays since 1989. Formerly known as the SkyDome, the multipurpose stadium also hosts concerts by some of the biggest names in music. The stadium is well-known for its retractable roof, a groundbreaking innovation when it was first built in 1989.
- Root for the home team at a **Toronto Blue Jays** game. (Seasonal, pending home schedule)

Day 4:

- Go into the wild at the **Toronto Zoo**! Interactive exhibits offer a unique wildlife experience that inspires visitors to champion and protect our wildlife habitats. Your visit takes you on a worldwide journey with southeast Asian tigers and orangutans, rainforest reptiles, African rhinos and giraffes, over 100 species of fish from the Great Barrier Reef, and more.
- Enter the curious and creative world of the **Ontario Science Center**. One of the world's first interactive science museums, OSC provides lifelong learners opportunities to learn about Canadian inventions and innovations, experience the intersection of art and science, experience live stage presentations, or conduct your own experiments!
- Depart for home.
