GREECE & ITALY

Day 1: Board your flight to Greece.

Day 2: Athens

- Meet with your tour director at Athens International Airport Eleftherios Venizelos.
- Board your private motor coach and depart on a guided panoramic tour of the Greek capital. You will see the Acropolis, the Panathenaic (Kallimarmaro) Stadium, Hellenic Parliament, the National Library, the Temple of Olympian Zeus, and more.
- Settle into your hotel before dinner.

Day 3: Argolis Peninsula

- Board your private motor coach and travel to **Epidaurus**, featuring the best-preserved **Ancient Theatre** in Greece, with acoustics that let actors be heard by all 15,000 spectators.
- Discover local agriculture with a visit to an olive plantation. A local guide will teach your group about the methods used to produce the country's famous export.
- Travel through orange groves and olive trees toward the archaeological site of Mycenae, a city with strong roots in Greek mythology.
- Continue to Nafplio, the first capital of Greece. Stop at Palamidi, a Venetian fortress overlooking the Mediterranean sea.

Day 4: Acrocorinth & Ancient Corinth

- Explore Ancient Corinth, with sites like the Temple of Apollo, the Peribolos of Apollo (an ancient covered square), and a museum that gives these monuments added context and meaning.
- Board your private motor coach and depart to Acrocorinth, a looming monolithic rock overlooking Ancient Corinth. The site was a Greek acropolis, a Roman citadel, and a Byzantine fortress. Many of the remaining ruins are from medieval times.
- On your way toward Delphi, stop at Arahova, a mountain village.

Day 5: Delphi & Athens

- Discover the ancient archaeological site of Delphi, recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site for its influence in the ancient world. Visit the Temple of Apollo, the Tholos of Delphi, and the Delphi Archaelogical Museum. The Omphalos of Delphi monument represents its role as the center of the world during Ancient Greek times.
- Board your private motor coach and return to Athens, where you'll embark on a tour of the Acropolis, an ancient fortress towering over 300 meters above the city of Athens. Admire the caryatids, sculptures of women serving as columns around the structure.

Day 6: Rome

- Board your private motor coach and depart to the airport, where you will take a flight to Leonardo da Vinci-Fiumicino Airport in Rome.
- Settle into your hotel for free time before dinner.

Day 7: Rome & Pompeii

- Board your private motor coach and depart on a guided tour of Pompeii, the infamous site of the Mount Vesuvius eruption in 79 AD, which decimated the city and its inhabitants in minutes.
- After free time for lunch, embark on a hike to the top of Mount Vesuvius, where you'll have a great view of the city and the volcanic fumes.
- Return to Rome for dinner.

Day 8: Rome

- Your first stop of the day is a tour of Vatican City, an independent state in the heart of Rome.
- Explore St. Peter's Basilica, a late Renaissance church that can hold nearly 60,000 people inside its intricately-decorated walls.
- The highlight of your tour will be the **Sistine Chapel**, with Michelangelo's masterful frescoes on the ceiling. Afterward, be sure to take a stroll through the Vatican gardens.
- After lunch, embark upon a walking tour of Rome's city center.
 Climb the Spanish Steps at Piazza di Spagna. Shop along
 Via Condotti and head to the Trevi Fountain, believed to hold
 mystical powers. Your tour ends at Piazza Navona near the
 Pantheon. Admire the Fountain of the Four Rivers, one of
 Bernini's Baroque masterpieces.

Day 9: Rome

- Take a guided tour of the Colosseum and the Roman Forum.
 The ancient elliptical amphitheater opened in 80 AD with 100 days of games and fights. Its massive stone structure opens a window into ancient Roman life and illuminates Rome's long history.
- After lunch, take a short walk up Palatine Hill to look down on the Forum, the center of Roman Parliament, and the Circus Maximus, the most famous stadium for chariot-racing during ancient times.
- Enjoy free time before dinner to revisit your favorite parts of Rome or do any last-minute souvenir shopping.
