

PERFORMANCE TOUR

Day 1: Board your flight to Italy.

Day 2: Rome

- Meet with your tour director at Leonardo da Vinci Airport.
- Take a guided tour of the **Colosseum** and the **Roman Forum**. The ancient elliptical amphitheater opened in 80 AD with 100 days of games and fights. Its massive stone structure gives a glimpse into ancient Roman life and illuminates Rome's long history.
- Take a short walk up Palatine Hill to look down on the Forum, the center of Roman Parliament, and the Circus Maximus, the most famous stadium for chariot-racing during ancient times.
- Music groups can **perform** for fellow visitors at the **Colosseum** or the **Roman Forum**.

Day 3: Rome

- Your first stop will be a tour of Vatican City, an independent state in the heart of Rome.
- Explore St. Peter's Basilica, a late Renaissance church that can hold nearly 60,000 people inside its intricately-decorated walls.
- The highlight of your tour will be the Sistine Chapel, with Michelangelo's masterful frescoes on the ceiling. Afterward, be sure to take a stroll through the Vatican gardens.
- Participate in a **performance** at an iconic Roman venue, such as **Piazza del Popolo**, **Piazza Navona**, or the **Pantheon**.
- Embark upon a walking tour of Rome's city center. Climb the Spanish Steps at Piazza di Spagna. Shop along Via Condotti and head to the Trevi Fountain, believed to hold mystical powers. Your tour ends at Piazza Navona near the Pantheon. Admire the Fountain of the Four Rivers, one of Bernini's Barogue masterpieces.

Day 4: Tuscany

- Depart for Siena. Upon arrival, set out on a guided walking tour of the city center, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Nestled in the Chianti hills, Siena is known for its combination of medieval churches, Renaissance palaces, and charming homes.
- Stop at Pisa, known for its iconic Leaning Tower.
- Travel to Lucca, birthplace of Giacomo Puccini. Visit the Puccini Birth Home and the Puccini Museum Today, the sites preserve musical scores and artifacts, including the Steinway & Sons piano on which he composed *Turandot* and other works.
- Explore the ancient city, famous for the Renaissance-era city walls that remain wholly intact. Inside the walls, **Piazza Citadella** and **Corte San Lorenzo** offer more ways to celebrate Puccini.

Day 5: Florence

- Travel to Florence, birthplace of opera. Upon arrival, take a guided walking tour of the Tuscan city, still a center of Italian culture.
- Your excursion will take you to the Piazza della Repubblica, Il Duomo, and the Piazza della Signoria.
- Take a closer look at famous destinations with guided tours of the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, the Baptistery of St. John, and the Ponte Vecchio.
- Walk across the Arno River and explore the Pitti Palace.

Day 6: Florence

- Explore the Galleria dell'Accademia, the famous home of Michelangelo's David. The Museum of Musical Instruments houses masterpieces by Stradivari and Bartolomeo Cristofori, the inventor of the piano.
- Step into the **Uffizi Gallery** for a guided tour of the museum.
- Hone your skills at a music or theatre performance clinic.
- Visit any landmarks you may have missed, like the church of Santa Croce. Built in 1294, it houses Giotto's frescoes and the tombs of Michelangelo, Galileo, and Machiavelli.

Day 7: Bologna

- Travel to Bologna and enjoy a walking tour of the historic city center. The city's architecture is known for is distinctive red, orange, and yellow tones. Be sure to walk under one of the city's many "porticoes," or covered walkways.
- Before departing for Venice, explore the Martini Museum & Conservatory, originally founded in 1804 as a philharmonic school. In 1942, it became a conservatory of music named after famed composer Giovanni Battista Martini.

Day 8: Venice

- Board a vaporetto (waterbus) to the island of **Murano** to witness their famous glass-blowing process.
- Return to Venice and enjoy a guided walking tour of the unique city, a series of more than 100 islands connected by canals and bridges. Visit the Bridge of Sighs, the Rialto Bridge, the Basilica di San Marco, and Piazza San Marco with its iconic clock tower. Grab a table at a local café to sample Venetian pastries and snacks.
- Music groups can perform at Campo Santo Stefano.

Day 9: Depart to the airport for your flight home.
