

#### Day 1:

- Dive into the refreshing blue waters of the Pacific Ocean! Enjoy free time on a local beach. Have lunch at a beachfront cafe or explore local shops selling artisanal wares.
- Enjoy dinner at the **Farmers Market**, dating back to July 1934. The historic LA landmark features produce vendors, food stalls, and restaurants.

Commonly known by its original name, Grauman's Chinese Theatre, the venue dates back to 1927 and has been home to numerous film premieres. The front of the theatre is lined with the handprints and footprints of famous movie stars, directors, producers, and Hollywood icons.

#### **Day 4:**

- Journey to Universal Studios Hollywood™, including a studio tour or a trip to the Wizarding World of Harry Potter. The park houses one of the oldest film studios in Hollywood still in use, rides and attractions based on blockbuster films, and a number of restaurants, shops, and movie theatres.
- Perform for park visitors at Universal CityWalk.
- After dinner, visit the Walt Disney Concert Hall, designed by Frank Gehry. The performance venue is known for the modern stainless steel curves that make up its facade. You may even catch the Los Angeles Philharmonic putting on a show.

#### **Day 5:**

- Explore the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, the largest art museum in the west. Its 150,000 works catalog prehistoric to contemporary art, and the museum also offers film and concert series throughout the year.
- Go behind the scenes on a tour of Hollywood's major sights, including the Walk of Fame, El Capitan Theatre, Grauman's Egyptian Theatre, famous film locations, and the Oscars Red Carpet Awards Walk. You'll also learn the history of how Hollywood became the capital of the film industry.
- Dive into the recording industry when you visit The GRAMMY Museum. Opened in 2008, the museum celebrates all aspects of the music industry, from technology to varied artforms and performers, and explores how music impacts our society and culture.
