Executive Director's Report on the State of the District

Mr. Chip VanSteenberg, Executive Director, spoke briefly on the district's assets, cash reserves and capital funds, call volume, and new 9-1-1 technology.

MCECD carries out its duties by:

- Providing and maintaining hardware and software along with the voice and data network for a countywide 9-1-1 system
- Equipping and supporting all four public safety answering points (PSAPs) in the county and a back-up facility at the county's Emergency Operations Center
- Providing financial support to the two Primary PSAPs which initially answer all 9-1-1 calls and route them to the appropriate PSAP depending upon the location and nature of the emergency
- Maintaining a geographic information system (GIS) and a comprehensive database of street names, address

ranges, service boundaries and other critical information

- Serving as the official addressor for the entire county
- Providing an early warning communication service
- Providing other services to aid and assist telecommunicators manage 9-1-1 calls effectively and efficiently
- Conducting public education for when and how to use the 9-1-1 system
- Assisting the PSAPs in training call-takers and dispatchers in the use of the 9-1-1 system
- Monitoring and participating in 9-1-1 related regulatory matters at the national and state level

Resolution for the Continuation of the 9-1-1 District and the Emergency Service Fee

Mr. Virgadamo noted item two of the agenda, consider and take action on a resolution for the continuation of the 9-1-1 district and the emergency service fee.
