Day 1

Tour Midtown, Rockefeller Center, St. Patrick's Cathedral, NBC Studio Photo Stop /Gift Store

Look up and enjoy the iconic buildings such as the Empire State Building, Chrysler Building, and the U.N. On your tour of the largest commercial, entertainment, and media center in the United States.

Lunch

Tour Central Park

Stroll through the oldest landscaped park in the U.S. and the shooting location of more than 300 movies.

5th Avenue Walk, NBC Store, Tiffany & Co

Historic landmarks and stylish retailers await you in one of America's most expensive shopping districts.

Dinner

Tour Empire State Building

Your visit begins in an elegant art deco lobby with murals adorning the stone walls. The tour features a new Sustainability Exhibit and Dare to Dream Exhibit that tells the story of the history, design, and engineering that made this iconic American skyscraper a reality. Visit the observation deck on the 86th floor for a bird's-eye view of the city.

Day 2 Breakfast

Tour Financial District, Federal Hall, Photo Wall Street Bull, US Customs House, 9/11 Memorial

A tribute to American government and capitalism, this district is home to historic sites, new buildings, and important memorials.

Tour Ellis Island

More than 100 million Americans can trace their ancestry to immigrants who passed through Ellis Island. This historic station is home to interactive exhibits that personalize the immigrant experience. Ellis Island is only accessible by a ferry ride that includes a pass by Liberty Island, home of the Statue of Liberty.

Lunch

Tour Chinatown, Little Italy, Soho and Greenwich

A great follow up to Ellis Island is a tour of the unique ethnic and cultural areas of NYC. The distinctive architecture, history, and shops in each part of the City are like new worlds to explore.

Dinner

Shopping in Time Square

You will be energized by the lights, sounds, and people who make this part of New York so iconic.

Day 3 Breakfast

Tour General Grant National Memorial

The largest mausoleum in North America is a respectful tribute to the Commanding General of the Union Army and, later, President of the United States who fought to unify a nation and ensure rights for all people.

Tour The Metropolitan Museum of Art

The largest art museum in the U.S. offers a view of other cultures and eras through the lens of creative arts in 400 galleries.

Tour Harlem, Apollo Theater

Strivers Row, Abyssinian Baptist Church, Harlem Walk of Fame (Group can choose Bronx Tour in place of Harlem Tour.)
Originally named after the city of Haarlem in the Netherlands when it was organized as a Dutch village in 1658, this northern section of Manhattan also was home to the Harlem Renaissance in the 1920s, a period of great artistic work within the American black community.
