Day 1

Arrival - Meet your On-site Coordinator and Licensed Tour Guide.

Picture Stop at White House - The "People's House" is a great place for selfies and group photos.

Tour World War II Memorial and Vietnam Memorial - These memorials are here in remembrance of the spirit, sacrifice, and commitment of soldiers and the American people during WWII and the Vietnam War.

Tour Holocaust Museum - Powerful exhibits and symbolic design teach about WWII and the Holocaust, remember the survivors and victims, and confront genocide and anti-Semitism.

Dinner

Night Tour of The Memorials - Be humbled by Lincoln's grandeur and reminded of the relevance of his words today. Walk over to appreciate the symbolism of the memorial to those who made the ultimate sacrifice in the Korean War under the night stars.

Day 2

Breakfast

Tour Ford's Theatre - This restored theatre commemorates Lincoln's life in the place of his assassination. A lower-level museum chronicles events of the Civil War and Lincoln's presidency. Cross the street to tour the Peterson House where Lincoln drew his last breath.

Tour National Archives - View the documents, maps, and photographs that record the American story, including The Declaration of Independence, Constitution, and Bill of Rights.



Lunch

Tour Capitol Hill - Go to the U.S. Capitol Visitors Center and Gallery to begin a tour of the home of the legislative branch. Walk across to First Street to tour The Library of Congress and the Supreme Court of the United States.

Tour Air and Space Museum - This is the world's largest collection of aviation and space artifacts where you can trace the importance of scientific discovery in air and space.

Dinner

Night Tour in Alexandria - Get spooked on a narrated tour of Old Alexandria and its historic graveyard.

Day 3

Breakfast

Tour Arlington National Cemetery - Statesmen and soldiers of the United States Armed Services are buried here. Witness the Changing of the Guard at The Tomb of the Unknowns and pay your respects at Kennedy's eternal flame. Visit the Iwo Jima Memorial just outside the Cemetery.

Lunch

Tour American History Museum - Artifacts that we hold dear proudly tell the story of what it means to be an American.

Tour Natural History Museum - Exhibits showcase unrivaled scientific collections such as fossils, moon rocks, and crown jewels, including the mysterious Hope Diamond.

Dinner

Tour Roosevelt and Jefferson Memorials - Both memorials feature iconic words amidst statues of the revered Presidents they remember. Tour Martin Luther King, Jr. Memorial.

Breakfast

Tour 9/11 Pentagon Memorial - Walk among the 184 benches that symbolize the lives lost at the Pentagon on September 1, 2001.

Tour Mount Vernon - Homestead of America's first President and his final resting place, Mount Vernon is an active farm that takes you back in time to experience 18th century agriculture and a breathtaking view of the Potomac River.
