Job Title: Special Agent

Job City: Houston & San Antonio (2 Positions)

Company Name: National Insurance Crime Bureau

Job Description: The Special Agent is the primary NICB contact with its member companies in providing advice with regard to preventing and combating insurance related crime and fraud in their designated geographical areas. NICB Special Agents provide a wide range of expertise to member companies and law enforcement in multiple areas related to medical billing fraud, property and casualty fraud, workers compensation fraud, vehicle theft, cargo theft and the theft of specialized equipment*.

Responsibilities:

- Review questionable claims submitted by member companies to independently decide which ones merit further investigation for possible fraud and/or criminal activity.
- Make an independent determination as to the best method to proceed on the questionable claims which will be further investigated.
- Request claim files from member companies and review the claim files to make an independent determination whether or not there is evidence of fraud or criminal activity.
- When opening a case or writing reports, determine the security designation.
- Coordinate multi-carrier, multi-claim investigations with law enforcement and member companies.
- After evaluation of the facts of an investigative matter, if the Special Agent is of the opinion that a crime has
 occurred, he or she then makes a recommendation to law enforcement as to which individuals and/or entities
 have in the Special Agent's judgment, violated a criminal statute(s).
- After evaluation of the facts of an investigative matter, if the Special Agent is of the opinion that a licensed professional, such as a doctor or lawyer, should have adverse action taken against their professional license, then the Special Agent will make a recommendation as to what complaint should be made to the licensing authority.
- When presenting a matter to law enforcement or prosecutors for further investigation, prepares an investigative report detailing their findings.
- Hosts meetings with member companies and law enforcement to provide training and information on the latest trends in insurance related crime and fraud.
- Provide training to member company's claims and SIU personnel, along with law enforcement in how to identify insurance related crime and fraud.
- May testify in court, usually as a subject matter or expert witness.
- May provide interviews to the press as the representative of the NICB in the areas within Special Agent's subject matter expertise.
- May provide advice to member companies and governmental authorities with regard to recommended legislative changes.
- Maintain membership in appropriate professional organizations and may assume a leadership position in such organizations which further NICB's mission.
- Act as a consultant to member companies in the assigned geographic area on identifying insurance related crime and fraud.
- Author *Fore*Warn Alerts to be provided to designated Member Company personnel providing updates on investigations and information on fraud related schemes and trends.

- Work within the budget for their operation, including providing and overseeing money budgeted to support law enforcement operations.
- Identify potential new member companies.
- Become a recognized functional expert in identifying insurance related crime and fraud
- Such other duties as may be required to fulfill NICB's mission.

Job Description: The Special Agent functions as the investigative arm of the NICB, working in cooperation with member insurance companies, law enforcement and other associated agencies to combat insurance related crime. Responsible for initiating and conducting medical fraud investigations which result in the dismantlement of clinics and staged accident rings, arrests of those involved, loss mitigations, restitution and reduction of insurance fraud.

Responsibilities:

- Conducts timely and thorough, multi-claim, multi-carrier criminal investigations.
- Collects, analyzes, and calculates relevant data for use in investigations.
- Works closely with the Field Information Analyst.
- Properly documents all phases of investigative activity.
- Prepares summary investigative presentations for submission to law enforcement/prosecutor.
- Represents NICB in criminal court, often testifying as an expert witness.
- Serves as liaison with member insurance companies, law enforcement and government agencies to promote and provide the full range of NICB services.
- Provides comprehensive training to member insurance companies and L/E on related insurance crime matters.
- Functions as a "technical" expert in medical fraud investigations and identifying insurance fraud schemes/claim file review.
- Maintains membership in appropriate professional organizations.
- Works well with others in a Task Force environment / a team player.
- Establishes and maintains business relationships with member insurance companies, law enforcement, regulatory agencies and vendors.
- Identifies potential new member customers.
- Other duties as assigned.
