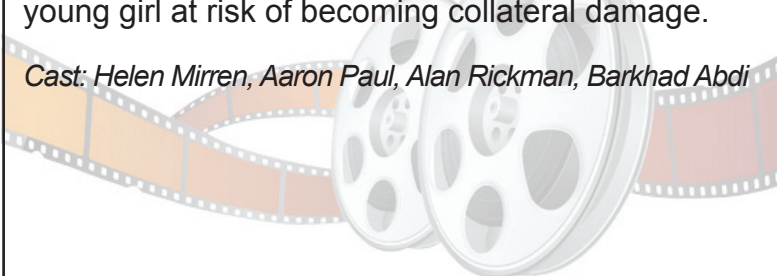

Finally, Grammy Award-winning violinist James Ehnes, who makes his home in Bradenton and is one of the most sought-after violinists on the international stage, joins Sarasota Orchestra for Shostakovich’s Violin Concerto No.1. Shostakovich put this rich, “subversive” work on the shelf for seven years, until after Stalin’s death. The concerto depicts winter’s harsh, crystalline beauty, with anti-Stalinist themes ever present beneath the surface.

Monday, January 7th – Readers Theatre Outing: Lemon Bay Playhouse Reader’s Guild – We are off to join the Lemon Bay Reader’s Theatre Guild as our January meeting. Their monthly meetings are open to anyone interested in reading or hearing plays in a group setting. A variety of plays and other materials adapted for Readers Theater format are read and the roles rotated to include as many participants as possible.

Monday, January 7th – Van Wezel “Something Rotten” – SOMETHING ROTTEN! is “Broadway’s big, fat hit!” (New York Post). Set in 1595, this hilarious smash tells the story of Nick and Nigel Bottom, two brothers who are desperate to write a hit play. Tuesday, January 8th – Englewood Performing Arts Series “Kingston Trio” – Fans of legendary folk icons The Kingston Trio will soon have an opportunity to re-discover their timeless music in a national tour to mark the group’s 60th anniversary on a national tour performing many of the Trio’s best-loved songs. All three current members, Mike Marvin, Tim Gorelangton and Bob Haworth have intrinsic links to and experience with the original group: Mike is the adopted son of founding member Nick Reynolds, who was also his musical mentor; Tim, a close friend since boyhood, is one of the few musicians outside the Trio who has recorded with Nick Reynolds; and Bob Haworth, who has performed with the original Trio for periods between 1985-1999 when Nick Reynolds was unable to tour. Many of their personal memories recall the iconic trio’s performances and journey as folk music made its extraordinary ascent to the pinnacle of popular culture & emdash; and the top of the music charts.

Wednesday, January 9th – Venice Area Quilters Guild “Knit & Stitch” – Come join the members of the Venice Area Quilters Guild as they meet for their monthly get-together here at Jacaranda Trace in the Arts & Crafts Room. The group will be working on quilts for Hospice and Head Start. Sometimes they work on personal projects too. Horns are the focus in Richard Strauss’s playful Till Eulenspiegel’s Merry Pranks. Romantic composer Robert Schumann’s Piano Concerto, Op. 54 features guest soloist, Andrew Tyson, Hailed by the New York Times for “playing with passion and poetry.” The final piece will be William Walton’s Suite from the classic film “Henry V.”
