This year's honorees, AeroFarms and RBH Group, have finished the first phase of construction of AeroFarms' 9th and newest indoor vertical farm - set to be the world's most productive, in a converted steel factory in Newark, NJ. When completed, AeroFarms will have the capacity to grow up to 2 million pounds per year of baby leafy greens and herbs in an environmentally controlled, safe, and sanitary facility, providing healthy, great tasting foods to the local community. As one of the founding members of the Ellen MacArthur Circular Economy 100, AeroFarms is a model for successful, sustainable farming, offering 130 times more productivity per square foot annually than a traditional field farm with 95% less water and zero pesticides.
