### **Revenue & Expense Highlights**

- ⇒ Assessment projections for commercial and residential are difficult to project, the commercial assessments were projected under budget. Commercial assessments include new businesses and apartments that come online.
- ⇒ Slightly under on revenue in Aquatics and Programs. Program revenue generally comes from sponsorships.
- ⇒ Increase in facility rentals which include parks, pools, rooms and the Cube.
- ⇒ Assessment dues increased in 2018 for additional infrastructure coming online, this includes parks and a new pool.
- ⇒ Utilities generally increase from year to year. Utilities include water and gas, which are integral with keeping the pools heated and the grounds being watered.
- $\Rightarrow$  \$75,000 will be put into the Reserve and Improvement fund. These monies are used for improvement in the Community.
- ⇒ Assessment receivables have been steady, higher commercial receivable past due generally are when new buildings/apartments are built.

#### **Aquatics**

- **2018 Aquatics Guide** The 2018 Aquatics Guide was distributed. This guide will be in resident mailboxes the first week of March.
- <u>Swim Lesson Registration</u> Resident swim lesson registration begins March 14 at noon online or in person at either of the MCA offices. Non-Resident registration begins April 25 at noon in person at either of the MCA offices or by filling out a registration form.
- <u>Membership Card Passes</u> The online discount has been removed, the annual membership fee is \$20 per person.
- <u>Swim Team</u>— New Swimmer parent meeting Tuesday, March 6 at 6:00pm at the Cube. Resident swim team registration begins on March 7 online or in person at either of the MCA offices. Non-Resident registration begins April 25 in person at either of the MCA offices or by filling out a registration form. There are two different leagues, Stapleton Swim League (SSL) at Jet Stream and Aviator, which is the recreational league. The Metro League is hosted at Runway 35 and is a more traditional league.
