Program Summary

United Way of Central Iowa (UWCI) believes one of the clearest paths to economic self-sufficiency is education and training. Job training and readiness programs remain critical to advancing low-wage, low-skilled workers into self-sustaining jobs. To help fulfill our mission to improve lives by uniting the care power of our community, UWCI and its' Central Iowa Works initiative has developed a program that ensures individuals leaving incarceration have the skills necessary to secure long-term employment. The **Central Iowa Returning Citizens Achieve (CIRCA) Program** goal is that 75% of the individuals served will secure employment and less than 20% will return to prison. UWCI is seeking a Peer Support Specialist to join the CIRCA team to reach this goal.

Position Summary

The Peer Support Specialist (PSS) assists and guides clients toward the identification and achievement of specific goals defined by the client. The work performed by this position will promote community socialization, successful reentry, self-advocacy, self-help, and development of natural supports. The candidate selected for this role will need to have personal experience in successfully reentering the community from incarceration and the ability to successfully complete peer support training as provided by the organization. The Peer Support Specialist works closely with the CIRCA case managers to identify clients who would benefit from peer support and mentoring. There will be some travel to correctional facilities in Newton and Mitchellville, The CIRCA program and this position is funded by a federal grant and is time limited and based on continued grant funding. This fulltime position is eligible for our benefits package and works Monday-Friday with mostly daytime hours and early evenings on occasion.
