

Rules of Engagement Hâck The Hague 2019

Our co-organiser Cybersprint and I would like to thank you for coming. Your contribution is enabling the Municipality to become more resilient to cyber attacks and to work for a secure city of The Hague. Furthermore, you will not work in a separate test environment, instead we are putting our real systems to the test.

To give you the best opportunity to demonstrate your skills, we have arranged a few things for you. During Hâck The Hague, food and drinks are available on the counters, in the crates in the corridors and during the award ceremony with drinks and pizza. You can submit your findings on the portal of our partner Zerocopter.

As mentioned previously, there are also money prizes to be won in the following categories:

- Most Impactful Hack - **Professional Hacker** (1st, 2nd and 3rd prize)
- Most Impactful Hack - **Student Hacker** (1st, 2nd and 3rd prize)
- Most Surprising Hack (1st, 2nd and 3rd prize)
- Most Sophisticated Hack (1st, 2nd and 3rd prize)

During the hackathon you may always approach the jury (with a **black** badge) or someone from the organisation (with a **blue** badge) with any questions you may have.

There are also a few things to bear in mind. These are listed below.

Participants of Hâck The Hague 2019 must comply with the following rules

Reporting findings and a Zerocopter account

Please submit your findings on: <https://0copter.com/HTH2019>

Log in using an existing account or create a new account. We will not be able to trace anonymous findings and the jury will only assess the findings that are submitted through an account. Teams must work with one joint account in Zerocopter. Someone from the organisation will come round with a list to check which email address is linked to your Zerocopter account so that we can trace the findings to the right person or team.

The jury will also look at the argumentation of your finding. If you submit a fully automated report, you need to fill in a description of what you did.

Please check that your finding has been accepted. The description may not be adequate or the finding may have already been found by someone else.

Method, monitoring and disruptions

Hâck The Hague 2019 takes place in the live environment of the Municipality of The Hague. The excessive generating of traffic with automatic tools such as Dirbuster, Nmap, Skipfish and so on to scan the environment broadly, must therefore be limited (non-intrusive).

The following methods are NOT permitted:

- any form of Denial of Service attack;
- brute-forcing and "flood based" attacks;
- emptying of databases or changing records.

If you suspect that you may have caused a disruption, stop your work immediately and inform the jury (with black badge) or someone from the organisation (with blue badge) directly.

The work must be stopped immediately at the organisation's request.

If you have any questions, ask the jury or someone from the organisation. They are recognisable by the colour of their Hâck The Hague 2019 badge and they will be introduced during the kick-off.

Handling findings

Findings may not be exploited beyond the minimum requirement. Demonstrate the vulnerability with a Proof of Concept.

The findings may not be shared with other teams.

Points

No points will be awarded for the following:

- missing cookie-flags on non-sensitive cookies;
- reports about insecure SSL/TLS configurations (unless you can clearly demonstrate why this is important);
- missing HTTP security headers (unless you can clearly demonstrate why this is important);
- social engineering (including phishing);
- bulk creation of accounts, files or folders.
