7 Awesome Animals from Patagonia







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Magellanic Woodpecker

Listen closely for the sounds of the Magellanic woodpecker. It makes a loud sound as it hits its beak against the trees. Once spotted, this bird is not hard to identify due to its bright red head, black body and white stripe on its back.

Mountain Lion (Puma)

If you are lucky, you might spot this elusive big cat in Patagonia. It is the region's biggest predator, feeding off different mammals. The mountain lion has powerful back legs and strong paws, allowing it to jump high and creep through various terrain.

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Chilean Flamingo (Flamenco Chileno)

Search along the lagoons and lakes in Patagonia for this beautiful, pink-colored bird. They are social creatures, often seen living in large groups.

Upland Goose (Caiquen)

The Upland goose is a territorial bird that is sometimes seen waddling along the open grassfields. It likes to snack on



Culpeo Fox (Zorro Culpeo)

Found exclusively in South America, this species of fox can be spotted sneaking around some of the national parks in Patagonia. It has a gray and rustic-brown coat of fur and often comes out to play at night.

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Andean Condor (Cóndor Andino)

The Andean condor is a large bird that glides along the windy cliffs and hilltops. It weighs up to 15kg and has a wingspan stretching up to 3m. The condor is mostly black, but has a ring of white on its neck and patches of white on the back-end of its wings.

Guanaco

The guanaco is a relative of the llama and has brown and white fur. When it senses danger is near, the guanaco makes a loud, alarming noise to alert other members of its herd.
