NEW SUSTAINABLE ACTIONS

SAY "NO" TO SINGLE-USE PLASTIC:

In efforts to employ new eco-friendly practices, EcoCamp is taking a stance to eliminate all single-use plastic from the facilities. This travel season, the hotel has reusable water bottles and lunch boxes available for travelers who participate in daily excursions.





ECOCAMP ACCESSIBILITY DOME:

This season, EcoCamp transformed one of its Domes into a fullyaccessible Dome to accommodate travelers who use a wheelchair. The Dome is equipped with an entry ramp, special handle in the bathroom and other accessible features. This, along with various inclusive travel opportunities, helps bring a diverse range of travelers to the hotel.

CULTURAL IMMERSION PROGRAMS:

EcoCamp Patagonia is bringing a sense of cultural awareness to its staff and travelers. The hotel received a visit from Tokerau Haho Hei, a native from Easter Island. who performed traditional music and led a chat about astrology and culture. Additionally, EcoCamp hosted individuals from the Kaweskar indigenous community who taught staff members about their native culture. Many people believe the Kaweskar people have completely disappeared, but EcoCamp shows that their culture is still alive!

FALL YOGA RETREAT:

In April, Susanne Steiger will be leading a <u>6-day Yoga Retreat</u> at EcoCamp Patagonia.
