PATHS Preschool/Kindergarten Review

You may want to save (or repeat) some of these review Extension Activities for when you get to Lessons 42 and 43, which do not have Extension Activities. Reviewing over several days will help the children learn the feelings more effectively.

ACTIVE GAMES **Copy the Feeling**

Have a child pick a Feeling Face card out of a hat and demonstrate how someone would look if he or she were walking and feeling that way. For example, if someone were mad, he or she would be frowning and stamping his or her feet. Have everyone else imitate the leader.

Musical Feelings

Put the Feeling Faces cards in a hat in the middle of the circle. Pass a hand mirror around the circle. Play music. When the music stops, the child holding the mirror picks a Feeling Face card and makes a face that describes the feeling. The other children have to guess the feeling that the child is expressing.

“Turtle” Cards

Use the sets of cards you developed in Lesson 10 to play matching games, memory games, “Go Fish” and other table games with the cards.

**TABLE/QUIET
ACTIVITIES****Thumbprint Autograph Book**

Make each child a book out of pieces of paper folded in half and stapled together. Children can get their friends’ “thumbprint autographs” by having them put their thumbs on a washable, nontoxic ink pad and roll them across the paper. This can also be made as a poster.

Things I Learned at School Book

Have each child make a book. You can put a picture of each child on the cover with his or her name or symbol. Have each child narrate all the things he or she learned during the year, and transcribe them into the book. A variation of this is to have the class make a book together.

Important Things Book

Have children make a book about something that is important about themselves (for example, “An important thing to know about Aisha is that she is a fast runner”). Start each sentence the same way, such as “An important thing to know about (name) is _____.”

PATHS Decorations

Make a stackable decoration by painting ten or more large round ice-cream containers (from an ice-cream store) or round oatmeal containers different colors. Enlarge pictures of the *Twiggle Learns to Do Turtle* characters and glue one to the side of each painted container. Alternatively, you can enlarge the Feeling Faces cards and glue one to the side of each painted container. Stack the containers in a pyramid or pole shape and tape together, if desired.
