

The Donor Egg Opportunity Plan

The only all-inclusive fertility treatment plan with donor egg that includes medications

For many couples treated at RMA of Connecticut, IVF procedures using a donor egg can make it possible to achieve a pregnancy and have a baby. To help make this option available for couples who do not have insurance coverage for fertility treatments, RMA of Connecticut offers the **Donor Egg Opportunity Plan.**

In an IVF procedure using donor eggs, the donor is stimulated with fertility medications to produce multiple eggs. The eggs are then retrieved and combined with sperm to create an embryo, which is transferred into the uterus to achieve a pregnancy. In many cases, there are enough embryos available for both a fresh embryo transfer and a subsequent frozen embryo transfer. The Donor Egg Opportunity Plan is designed to reduce treatment costs while also giving couples the best chance to achieve a pregnancy.

How the Donor Egg Opportunity Plan works

Patients who choose The Donor Egg Opportunity Plan at RMACT will pay an inclusive total of \$34,000. This includes a fresh embryo transfer and a subsequent frozen embryo transfer (FET) if the fresh transfer does not result in a pregnancy. The Donor Egg Opportunity Plan includes:

Donor Fees

- All services related to donor selection, medical screening and compensation
- Psychological testing
- Genetic testing and consultation with a genetic counselor
- Cycle medications
- Cycle monitoring
- Anesthesia for egg retrieval
- Egg retrieval

Recipient Fees

- In-cycle monitoring (blood work and ultrasounds during morning monitoring hours)
- Cycle medications and medications for the subsequent FET if applicable
- All embryology laboratory procedures. This includes:
 - » ICSI (if needed)
 - » Assisted hatching
- Embryo transfer
- Embryo cryopreservation (freezing) and the first year of storage

Patient financing plans offered by some IVF centers try to reduce cost in many ways such as not including medications in their plan or limiting laboratory procedures to a set number of eggs or embryos. Our plan treats each and every patient with the highest quality medical care and services including optimal doses of all medications to achieve a successful pregnancy.

What is NOT included in RMACT's Donor Egg Opportunity Plan

- Checklist blood work including any required follow-up testing
- Uterine evaluation (HSG, SIS/SHG, Hysteroscopy)
- Any outside monitoring
- Egg (oocyte) freezing
- Semen analysis and sperm freezing
- TESE/MESA if required

- Pregnancy testing at the conclusion of the cycle
- Medical treatment subsequent to your cycle such miscarriage, biochemical or ectopic pregnancy.
- Psychological evaluation for the recipient
- Mock cycle
- Costs associated with the use of a surrogate

Important details regarding refunds

You can withdraw from The Donor Egg Opportunity Plan at any time. Recipients can receive a refund of about 80% of the fee if the donor does not respond to treatment to stimulate egg development. The refund is based on the number of days the donor has been on medication to stimulate the production of eggs.

- If a donor has been on medication for six days or less, the refund is \$28,510.
- If the donor has been on medication for seven days or more, the refund is \$26,520.
- If your fresh cycle does not result in a pregnancy and you do not have any cryopreserved embryos for your subsequent FET you will receive a refund of \$5,000.
