11th May: Back-to-School Arrangements

The status quo will be maintained for MYP5, DP1 and DP2 until at least 8 June.

MYP1-MYP4 Back-to-School Arrangements

MYP1 and MYP2 will attend lessons on the Roches Grises campus between 11 May and 8 June, given the availability of additional rooms in the absence of MYP5, DP1 and DP2. The MYP rooms at Praz-Dagoud will thus be liberated for Infant and Primary use. Students will receive further information about the first day and their new timetables from their Lead Tutor by Friday 8 May.

DAILY ARRIVAL

- Adults are requested not to enter the buildings at arrival time. All students should be dropped off at Praz-Dagoud as usual.
- The doors to both RG buildings will be open from 08:00 each morning. Students should enter the building, wash their hands and go directly to the classroom in which their first lesson takes place.
- Corridors and locker areas will be monitored by staff to stop students congregating in them and ensure they only use their designated classrooms.

DAILY DEPARTURE

- Adults are requested not to come into the school buildings at departure time.
- If coming to pick up their children, parents are asked to wait outside the Praz-Dagoud campus, respecting the 2 metre social distancing rule, or in their cars.
- Students will not be able to remain on campus at the end of the school day. They will be required to leave the school buildings and campus as soon as possible after their last lesson. Only students who have signed up for 'study supervision' will be able to stay after school until 17:00 at the latest.

MOVEMENT AROUND THE SCHOOL BUILDINGS AT ROCHES GRISES

Students should move around the school on the right hand side of stairs and hallways, and maintain sufficient distance between each other. They should not socialise in clusters.

LEARNING AND TEACHING

In line with the Canton of Vaud guidelines, no class will have more than 12 students in attendance. Arrangements will be made for larger classes to be split into two smaller groups. Half the class will be taught by the regular teacher whilst another staff member supervises the other half. The regular teacher will ensure that equivalent work is covered by all students.

- At the end of each lesson, ALL students will leave the building they are in under staff supervision. Teachers will then move to their next teaching room before ALL students are allowed back into the building under staff supervision. A slightly longer changeover time between lessons is expected.
- Teachers will ensure all classroom windows are kept open as much as possible, and outer doors will remain open.
- Teachers will apply the 2 metre distancing rule between themselves and their students.

ANY STUDENT WHO DOES NOT COMPLY WITH THESE GUIDELINES WILL BE SENT HOME.

CO- AND EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

- No assemblies or other large meetings will take place.
- No local, national or international field trips, sports competitions and school outings will take place for the rest of the 2019-2020 school year.
- The content of practical lessons, for example, sport, music, and drama lessons will be adapted to respect social distancing.
- Safety procedures will be implemented for the circulation of library books.

BREAK TIME PROCEDURE

- All students must wash or disinfect their hands before and after morning break each day. Sanitisers will be available.
- Students should play or socialise only with students in their year group and in their Year Group's designated area.
- In the event of a wet break time, all students will be supervised by a teacher in the classroom they were in just before break.
- Supervision will be increased in all areas during these times.

LUNCH SERVICE

The normal lunch service will be provided. There will be no self-service food or open containers of cutlery in accordance with the guidelines issued by the federal health department. Students should not share food or drink with each other.

- All students must wash or disinfect their hands before lunch each day. Sanitiser will be available at the entrance to the dining room and on the top floor of the new building.
- Students will wait at the back door to the old building (weather permitting) until told to enter to the dining room instead of lining up in the corridor as usual. Entry to the dining room will be controlled by a teacher.
- Students will be seated two to a table, diagonally. The seats next to each student will remain unoccupied. They will be invited table by table to collect their food.
- Packed lunches and food served from the cafeteria counter may be consumed outside, weather permitting, maintaining physical distancing rules and under supervision.
- The use of microwaves at lunchtime will not be permitted, so cold picnics or meals in heat-retaining containers should be prepared.

BUS SERVICES

The school bus service is expected to run on a modified timetable. Specific information will be provided.
