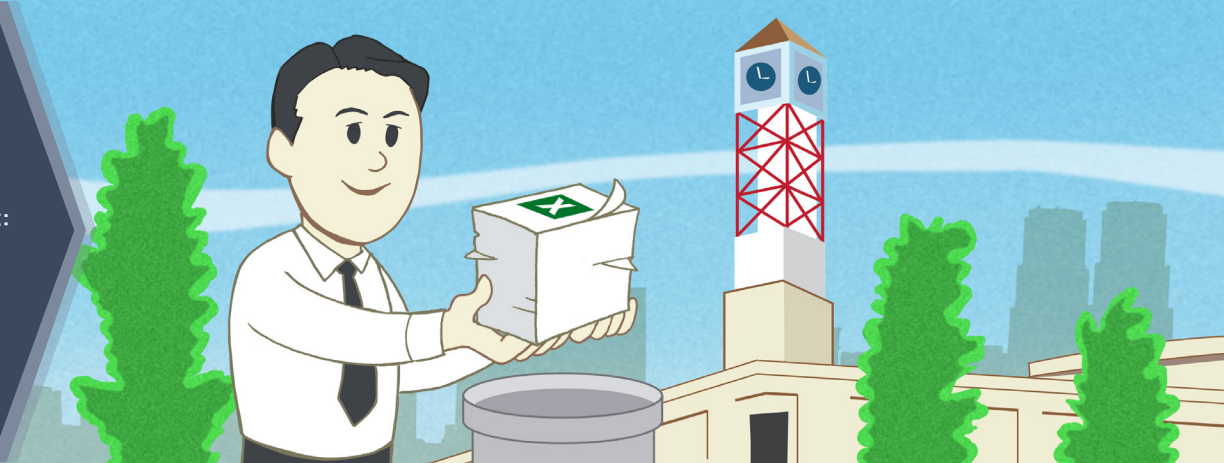

Lying on the shores of Lake Ontario, Mississauga is the sixth largest city in Canada. The City of Mississauga is an efficient and well-run organization governed by the Mayor and 11 Councillors. With a gross operating budget of \$671 million and a capital budget of \$175 million, the City relies on CaseWare Working Papers and Canadian Financials to ensure its financial statements are in good order and completed accurately and on time. The Old Spreadsheet Process

“We used literally dozens of Excel spreadsheets and Word documents.” says Mark Beauparlant, Manager of Corporate Financial Services. He describes the financial statement preparation process as very time consuming. “We’d put together a financial statement preparation model years ago, intending for it to be temporary until we could devise a better method. To date, we hadn’t found a solution that met our needs.”

“All the documents were independent of each other,” adds Barbara Campbell-Graves, the City’s Supervisor of Accounting. “If you made a change in one worksheet, you had to locate that data in several other documents and change it there too. There was always a concern that there would be errors or missing data.”

Implementation by Finance Experts

"In the past, the auditors would come in and we would be constantly opening workbooks and changing worksheets, making the necessary additions and adjustments," says Campbell-Graves. "Now it's a much simpler, more straightforward process."

"It's beautifully simple," adds Beauparlant. "Now, all of our working papers are in one document and they are completely integrated. If we change a number in one place, the change flows through to all the related documents."

"CaseWare has brought a tremendous amount of efficiency and time savings to our financial reporting tasks," adds Campbell-Graves.

Industry-Standard Tool

"Our auditors are very happy with our new system," says Beauparlant. "They use CaseWare internally, so they are very familiar with it. Our auditing contract

goes out to bid this year, and we'll be certain to note in our proposal request that we are using CaseWare as we fully expect that it will make the bids more competitive."

Delivering Value Beyond the Annual Financial Statements

FHB also implemented their FIR tool to automate the provincial reporting process too.

"We had been doing all of the schedules manually," explains Campbell-Graves.

"We're already using CaseWare to produce several of the schedules and think we can automate the majority of them by next year. That will really cut the time it takes us to produce the return."

Time for Analysis and Review

In the past, financial statement generation and the surrounding tasks might take several months, and staff always felt rushed. "It was a long and involved process before CaseWare," concludes Campbell-Graves.
