Jerry Knispel Retires After 49 Years



Jerry Knispel - Branch President, Fairbury

Jerry Knispel began his career at First National Bank of Fairbury (now Heartland Bank) one day after graduating from the University of Nebraska at Lincoln. And as he puts it, "I've been here ever since."

After 49 years with First National Bank of Fairbury and Heartland Bank, Jerry stepped down as the Branch President and announced his retirement. Jerry has been a fixture in the bank and the Fairbury community. He grew up six miles away in Jansen, attended Fairbury High School and returned after graduating college to raise his family.

Jerry's roles within the bank have been vast and include, Bookkeeper, Customer Service Associate, Cashier, Real Estate Loan Officer, Commercial and Ag Loan Officer, President, and most recently Branch President. Although he can't choose a favorite, he comments, "I enjoyed them all. I got to work with people of all positions, and I enjoyed that the most."

When asked about the most significant challenge Jerry faced in his career, he quickly responded, "Without a doubt the farm crisis of the mid-'80s. Real estate values had dropped 50-60%, low commodity prices, and interest rates were pushing 20%. No one can make money at that. It was a hard time for our bank, and it was a hard time for our customers." The biggest lesson he took away from the crisis was, **"when people are in a distressed situation, you get a lot further by working with them instead of trying to make the decisions for them."**

The amount of change Jerry witnessed is extensive, but the technology advancements are what resonate the most. Jerry also notes the amount of foot traffic in the bank is 25-30% of what it used to be because of the convenience mobile banking, direct deposit, and ATM's now provide.

Big plans await Jerry and his wife, Marci. With their extra time, they plan to golf a little more, travel and spend time with their seven grandchildren.

Avoid Gift Card Scams This Holiday Season

Gift cards are a convenient way to give a loved one a gift, but they're also a popular way for scammers to steal your money. Scammers will often have an urgent need for you to send money promptly, and will strongly urge you to load money to a gift card from a popular company, like iTunes, Amazon, or Walmart, as payment. The scammer will then demand the card numbers and PIN code on the back. Once you've given them that information, the scammer has access to the money loaded on the card and your money is usually gone without a trace.

Some scammers who demand gift card payments often include:

- Imposters calling from the utility company, threatening you to pay your electric bill with a gift card or your power will be shut off.
- Callers who say you've won a prize online, and ask you to pay fees and other charges with a gift card to receive the prize.
- An official claiming to be from the IRS, saying you owe money in back taxes or fines and will be prosecuted unless you send your payments with a gift card.
- A person from a tech company that requires gift card payment for repairing your computer.

These instances, and many more, are scams. If anybody asks you to pay via gift cards, it's a scam. Gift cards are meant to be gifts, not payments!

If you've paid a scammer with a gift card, call the company that issued the gift card immediately and let them know your gift card number was used in a scam. If you act quickly enough, they may be able to refund your money.

If you give or receive a gift card as a gift, here are some easy steps to follow:

- Buy gift cards from companies you know and trust. Avoid purchasing gift cards from online auction sites as they are most likely counterfeit.
- Keep your receipt with the gift card. You may need to show the receipt if your card is misplaced or stolen.
- Inspect the gift card before you purchase it to make sure none of the protective stickers have been removed, none of th
 codes have been scratched off or show the PIN number.
- Treat gift cards like cash and spend them as quickly as you can. It's not unusual to lose gift cards or forget you have them. Using them early will help you get the full value and avoid fees. If you lose your gift cards or they are stolen, report it to the card issuer immediately.

Remember, gift cards are meant to be gifts this holiday season, not payments. Report any type of scam or fraud to the Federal Trade Commission by calling 1-877-FTC-HELP or by visiting ftc.gov/complaint. If you have questions or concerns about a potential scam, call an associate at any Heartland Bank location.




