201 Economic impact

In 2019 the CIRI team of three Industrial Development Managers connected with 623 manufacturing and industrial firms (398 in-plant visits and 225 through a targeted email campaign) representing over 20,000 jobs*. CIRI provided valuable services to 246 different companies to address issues or opportunities associated with financing options, real estate and land assembly, building permits and zoning, employment and training, safety and security, infrastructure, and general business assistance. Additionally, CIRI engaged our many Partners including the City of Cleveland, Cuyahoga County, the National Development Council: Grow Cuyahoga County Fund, MidTown Cleveland, the Greater Cleveland Partnership, TeamNEO, MAGNET, and OhioMeansJobs to provide additional support and assistance to companies.

Service Interventions to six companies[†]

- Interventions affected 390 direct and indirect manufacturing jobs with an estimated annual payroll of \$17.6 million[‡].
- Generated \$1.55 million of capital investment in 2019 and an estimated \$1.7 million of additional investment planned in 2020.
- 55 new jobs planned upon completion of capital spending in 2020.

PMI Industries is a subsea engineering company that supports offshore industries around the globe, including oil and gas, seismic, renewable energy, and defense. PMI was awarded a government contract that required doubling production to meet contract requirements. Their plant was too small so options to expand or move were considered. The CIRI Industrial Development Manager worked closely with the company to locate a larger facility within the City of Cleveland but were unable to find a suitable space. Expansion became problematic when the company was told that a utility pole, that interfered with the expansion, could not be moved. The government contractor gave PMI a three-week ultimatum to confirm a plan to meet the production needs. PMI was under pressure to find a solution. The CIRI Manager contacted the City of Cleveland Department of Economic Development for help with finding a solution. The right contacts were made and the utility company agreed to move the pole, creating a clear path for PMI to meet the contract requirements. The City retained 20+ jobs with the potential for additional jobs, once the contract requirements are finalized.

Connective Marketing Solutions

Bush Integrated is a family owned business providing connective marketing solutions for over 30 years. Services include marketing and creative services, variable digital and traditional promotional products, and e-commerce enabled fulfillment and distribution. In 2019 the company began receiving lawn maintenance charges from the City of Cleveland for a vacant property they own near their facility. The property is maintained by the company's landscape contractor. The company reached out to the City on multiple occasions but were unable to resolve the misunderstanding. When the maintenance bills exceeded \$2,000, some of which had been included on their tax duplicate, Bush Integrated reached out to their Industrial Development Manager for help. The manager spoke with the Division of Park Maintenance and Properties to determine how to appeal the charges. She also requested a complete summary of all charges to include on the appeal. The CIRI Manager worked with Bush Integrated to complete the appeal form and submit it to the review board. Subsequently, all charges were cancelled.
