Situation

INDUSTRIAL TECHNOLOGY

Gotta Groove Records

Gotta Groove Records is a hidden treasure in Northeast Ohio. From its downtown Cleveland location, the company is celebrating ten years of serving the resurgent record album market as an innovative independent pressing plant. The company's explosive growth created problems, so Manufacturing Works proposed a new idea to improve plant throughput. The company installed a series of digital sensors that measure and upload machine operating information to the cloud, which then provides real-time information and analysis on machine utilization.

"We wanted a better way to track actual machine efficiencies, and we needed a solution that could work on our older technology presses. When we first saw the equipment, and the way that it would attach to any piece of production equipment, we decided to install one to find out if it would work.

It did. We started in February and are now using these units on three of our production presses. We track uptime by machine by month, and we're using the information to find inefficiencies in our processes."

City Plating

City Plating is a metal finishing shop, specializing in electroplating zinc and zinc nickel alloy for the automotive industry. The company is growing and with growth, comes opportunities to improve operations. In 2019 they started a project to monitor equipment and help determine when preventive maintenance is needed.

"Right now, we don't have a good way of knowing when the motor is under stress, so the motors operate until failure. And, they shouldn't have to fail because we're not monitoring this properly. In short, we're looking for an automated way to prevent premature failures."

PMI Industries

PMI Industries is a subsea engineering company that supports offshore industries around the globe, including oil and gas, seismic, renewable energy, and defense. PMI was awarded a government contract that required doubling production to meet contract requirements. Their plant was too small so options to expand or move were considered. The CIRI Industrial Development Manager worked closely with the company to locate a larger facility within the City of Cleveland but were unable to find a suitable space. Expansion became problematic when the company was told that a utility pole, that interfered with the expansion, could not be moved. The government contractor gave PMI a three-week ultimatum to confirm a plan to meet the production needs. PMI was under pressure to find a solution. The CIRI Manager contacted the City of Cleveland Department of Economic Development for help with finding a solution. The right contacts were made and the utility company agreed to move the pole, creating a clear path for PMI to meet the contract requirements. The City retained 20+ jobs with the potential for additional jobs, once the contract requirements are finalized.

"The CIRI team was most helpful finding a solution especially when the pressure was on. The Industrial Development Manager Kim McCarty was engaged from the start and provided us with great support."

Bush Integrated

Bush Integrated is a family owned business providing connective marketing solutions for over 30 years. Services include marketing and creative services, variable digital and traditional promotional products, and e-commerce enabled fulfillment and distribution. In 2019 the company began receiving lawn maintenance charges from the City of Cleveland for a vacant property they own near their facility. The property is maintained by the company's landscape contractor. The company reached out to the City on multiple occasions but were unable to resolve the misunderstanding. When the maintenance bills exceeded \$8,000, some of which had been included on their tax duplicate, Bush Integrated reached out to their Industrial Development Manager for help. The manager spoke with the Division of Park Maintenance and Properties to determine how to appeal the charges. She also requested a complete summary of all charges to include on the appeal. The CIRI Manager worked with Bush Integrated to complete the appeal form and submit it to the review board. Subsequently, all charges were cancelled.
