#### LETTER FROM THE BOARD CHAIR AND PRESIDENT

As WIRE-Net approaches its 20th year, our commitment to serving the leaders of our region's manufacturing firms remains central to our mission. In 2005, WIRE-Net's Board of Directors made a strategic decision to remove geographic boundaries that inhibited our ability to provide services and expertise to help strengthen manufacturing to create healthy communities and fuel economic growth.

This decision was made due to a growing number of requests for assistance from manufacturers across NE Ohio that were interested in manufacturing innovation and business assistance, workforce education and development, real estate and infrastructure expertise, and the desire on the part of company leaders to have an advocate for smart public policies that help manufacturing firms compete better locally and around the world.

WIRE-Net provided services to 566 manufacturing related firms during 2006, a 27% increase over 2005 – and over 1200 individuals attended workshops, business roundtables, and forums on a range of issues designed to stimulate business growth and improvement. This represents a 31% increase over the previous year. By year's end, 93% of our members had renewed their WIRE-Net membership, a strong indication of our responsiveness to their needs and interests.

We appreciate the continued support of our members, contributors, and community stakeholders. WIRE-Net's mission is to connect leaders to each other and to their communities. Due to a new partnership with Mayor Frank Jackson's administration, we have a renewed focus through the Cleveland Industrial Retention Initiative on Cleveland's 1000 manufacturing businesses, which employ 27,000 NE Ohio residents. Maintaining a healthy urban core is essential, as is supporting manufacturing across NE Ohio. Our partnership with the Cleveland/Cuyahoga County Workforce Investment Board, Cuyahoga Community College and others in a unique metals industries training initiative is a sign of our commitment to regional action. WIRE-Net will support, connect, and partner to ensure the continued prosperity of the region's manufacturing leaders. Our collective future depends on it.

WIRE-Net's manufacturing innovation service uses a practical approach to assist member companies with engineering support and technical expertise. WIRE-Net:

- Identifies and shares best practices among area manufacturing firms
- Makes the direct connection between innovation and successful manufacturing business strategy
- Provides both hands-on and peer-to-peer support for company leaders wanting to use innovation as a growth strategy, and
- Links company leaders to cost effective resources to assist with successful innovation implementation.

#### WIRE-Net's innovation program attracts manufacturing company leaders who want practical support to help them launch and sustain innovation initiatives within their organizations.

While 81 firms engaged in WIRE-Net's improvement and innovation events, the leaders of twelve manufacturing companies elected to join WIRE-Net's elite MIND program. Manufacturing Innovation for the Next Decade is a peer-to-peer based program that supports business leaders in their efforts to improve profits and competitive position by integrating people, product, and process innovation into their daily business practice.

Executives from this year's MIND group represent a mix of public and privately-held businesses with both union and non-union employees. Their product mix is equally diverse, representing capital equipment, chemicals, forgings and dies, metal fabrication, and commercial products which include plumbing supplies, hand tools, and paper tubes.

Since 2002, teams from 19 manufacturing companies\* have participated in the MIND program. These are among NE Ohio's most energetic business leaders. At the core of WIRE-Net's pioneering MIND program is our commitment to help them strengthen their companies by challenging and supporting their efforts to develop and improve upon a corporate culture that promotes on-going innovation. These are the firms that are helping to fuel economic growth throughout the region.

School-to-Career, WorkSource, and Employment Plus programs offer workforce solutions to strengthen area manufacturing firms by attracting and retaining the next generation of employees.

In 2006 WIRE-Net's elite School-to-Career program at Max S. Hayes Career & Technical High School created new opportunities for manufacturing firms to expose Cleveland area high school students to exciting careers in manufacturing.

**34** employers provided job shadowing or paid apprenticeship opportunities, hosted plant tours, or conducted speaking engagements. The

School-to-Career Program is building the next generation of leaders with **100%** of the Class of 2006 graduates now working, or pursuing post-secondary educational opportunities, or careers in the military.

In 2006 the WorkSource program was re-engineered to better meet employer needs. A 3-stage applicant screening process offers improved employee assessment and better retention support saving employers both time and money.

Our new WorkSource program made **32** successful job placements at an average wage of **\$11.19**, during its inaugural months,

resulting in an annualized direct economic impact of \$716,160.

In the 4th quarter, WIRE-Net's Employment Plus program was launched to meet employer demand for customized services that address the unique workforce challenges faced by individual companies.

WIRE-Net's new program offers specialized recruiting for professional positions, HR workforce assessment and retention planning, training curriculum development, and implementation of company-wide training and apprenticeship programs.

In 2006, WIRE-Net's new Accelerated Introduction to Manufacturing program – the AIM Camp – responded to Mayor Frank Jackson's plea to provide career-building summer opportunities for Cleveland students.

25 Cleveland Municipal School District students from 6 high schools were introduced to careers in manufacturing during an intensive 4-week

summer course, **24** of them completed the program!

- "Inside the Gate" engineering, organization development, human resource services and support, lean manufacturing, and new market development opportunities.

One of WIRE-Net's goals is to reduce isolation among the leaders of smaller manufacturing businesses through enhanced learning opportunities and networking programs. In 2006, business leaders from149 manufacturing firms participated in a variety of learning programs including:

- 2006 Innovation Celebration featuring IDEO General Manager and master innovator, Tom Kelley, who set out to convince over 225 business leaders that success is bred by individuals in companies that encourage ways to foster new ideas and originality;
- Christopher Celeste and Mitch Kroll of Findaway Ventures who proved how the seed of an idea can germinate and transform the way people learn by creating Playaway, the first self-playing digital audio book;
- Human Resource, Emergency Preparedness, and CFO Roundtables which offered manufacturing leaders solutions ranging from reducing workers' comp claims and controlling health care costs, to strategies to access workforce training dollars, and ways to prepare for a major disruption in daily operations;
- Customized ISO and Quality Training which, for 10 manufacturing firms, de-mystified the ISO audit process.

WIRE-Net's Redevelopment program was funded by individual, corporate, foundation, and government supporters including: WIRE-Net members companies, The BP Fund, The Cleveland Foundation, the City of Cleveland and Cleveland City Council members: Dona Brady, Kevin Kelley, and Jay Westbrook.

WIRE-Net is an active partner in and advocate for a citywide industrial land assembly strategy for the City of Cleveland. WIRE-Net has a goal of identifying 3-5 vacant and underutilized industrial sites for either short-term redevelopment opportunity (1-2 years) and/or inclusion in the City's Industrial Land Bank program for future redevelopment (3-5 years).

#### Closing the Book on Walworth Run

2006 marked the official end of WIRE-Net's efforts to redevelop the Walworth Run Industrial Park.

A shift in community priorities in late 2005 led to WIRE-Net's decision to sell the remaining acreage to the Cleveland Municipal School District. While we did not realize our initial objectives completely, WIRE-Net is proud that in the end we have been able to successfully remediate a site that accommodates both industrial activity and the community's need for a state-of-the art educational facility.

Some of the elements of success drawn from this project include:

- WIRE-Net successfully recycled a community brownfield site (including issuance of a Convenant Not To Sue from OEPA) resulting in a return to productive use for the community.
- WIRE-Net completed a project resulting in development of 2.7 acres for expansion/relocation of a local manufacturing enterprise. B & R Machine

built a new \$1million production facility on the site retaining

**18** jobs in 1999 without use of any public subsidy. As of January 2006

the company reported  $\mathbf{25}$  employees with plans for new hires in future months.

 WIRE-Net recovered its initial investments in the project site and has set aside a portion of these funds for future redevelopment efforts within the City of Cleveland.

#### Current Investment Opportunities

Efforts in 2006 helped position the City of Cleveland to acquire the **21** acre former Midland Steel property to help fill a gap in the supply of ready-to-build industrial land in Cleveland. WIRE-Net's role in the project is to create a model project by integrating environmental design principles and sustainability goals based upon LEED and Energy Star standards into the master plan for the site.

The Trinity site, former home to Monarch Aluminum, has long been a neighborhood eyesore. Working with community and city leaders, WIRE-Net and Cudell Improvement, Inc. teamed up to organize a celebration

event in October to begin building demolition, paving the way for **D** additional acres for industrial redevelopment on Cleveland's west side.

WIRE-Net's Advocacy work in 2006 was funded by individual, corporate, foundation, and government supporters including: WIRE-Net member companies, NEOCAM coalition members, Excel Mold & Machine, Inc., The Cleveland Foundation (infrastructure), and The City of Cleveland and Council members Dona Brady, Kevin Kelley and Jay Westbrook (infrastructure). WIRE-Net complies with I.R.S. regulation of non-profit lobbying by taking a section 501(h) election as part of its annual tax filing.

NEOCAM, WIRE-Net's advocacy effort supports smart public policies that strengthen NE Ohio's manufacturing base and stimulate growth. Established in 2004, the Northeast Ohio Campaign for American Manufacturing is a non-partisan coalition representing nine manufacturing, trade and civic groups with over 900 northeast Ohio manufacturing firms and 90,000 employees. In 2006 over 180 business leaders and coalition members held joint policy discussions with policymakers and influencers on a range of issues:

- Gubernatorial candidates Bryan Flannery, Jim Petro, and Ted Strickland discussed their strategies for stimulating Ohio's economy and mobilizing the state's workforce (former Lt. Governor Ken Blackwell declined his invitation to meet with us).
- Charlie Blum, President, International Advisory Services Group, Ltd., Advisor to the Metals Service Center Institute, and Executive Committee Member of the China Currency Coalition presented his "inside the beltway" report to NE Ohio manufacturers on the U.S. -China Economic Equation and the political and business ramifications of current legislative activity.
- Ryan Augsberger, Ohio's Manufacturers Association, discussed the impact on manufacturers of Ohio's Commercial Activity Tax adopted in June 2005 to broaden Ohio's tax base and reduce the tax burden on the businesses that pay personal property and franchise taxes.
- Alan Tonelson, Research Fellow at US Business and Industry Council (USBIC) and author of *The Race to the Bottom*; William Hawkins, Senior Fellow, USBIC; and Kevin Kearns, President USBIC, discussed the connections between current U.S. trade policy and the future of U.S. based manufacturing at a special event at the Cleveland City Club presented with the US Business & Industry Council (USBIC).
- Dan DiMicco, Vice Chairman, President and CEO of Nucor Corporation launched NEOCAM's speaker series, Perspectives on American Manufacturing, by discussing the global rules, trade practices, tax, and regulatory polices that pose challenges to U.S. manufacturing.
- Richard Stuebi, BP Fellow for Energy and Environmental Advancement at the Cleveland Foundation presented the case for NE Ohio manufacturing firms to enter fast-growing markets in wind, solar, fuel cells, biofuels, and clean coal.
- WIRE-Net, the City of Cleveland, the City of Brook Park, and Bellaire-Puritas Development Corporation sponsored a public meeting on the W. 150th Street Reconstruction (from Brookpark Road to Industrial Parkway) and Sanitary Sewer Addition/Extension (South of I-480 in the City of Brook Park). Randall DeVaul, Commissioner of Division of Engineering and Construction, City of Cleveland and Vince Adamus, Commissioner of Economic Development, City of Brook Park sought input from manufacturing company leaders on the project scope and the planned improvements.
- Our past work with Cleveland City Council members Dona Brady and Jay Westbrook, WEBCO, the Cuyahoga County Engineer's Office and the Cleveland Department of Economic Development and Division of Engineering paid off. The orange barrels along Berea Road and Jennings Road attest to our persistence in getting important industrial access roads rebuilt.
