



This week,
Governor
Greg Abbott
appointed
Cassie
Brown as the
Commissioner

of Worker's Compensation for Texas. Brown has worked at the Texas Department of Insurance since 2011 and will serve as the Workers' Comp Commissioner until February 1, 2019. Former Commissioner, Ryan Brannan, announced he was stepping down effective May 1.



SB 716, which would expand workers' comp benefits for first responders, was passed by the New Jersey

Senate 29-4 late last week. The bill allows firefighters with seven or more years of experience, rescue squad members, police, corrections officers, and

emergency medical workers to receive workers' comp benefits for cancer and lung disease. The bill is now before the House Labor Committee.



On Tuesday, the New York Senate passed <u>\$ 5670</u>. The bill requires prescribers to consult patients regarding

an opioid prescription before prescribing a schedule II. The prescriber is required to notify the patient that they may fill the script for a lesser quantity and inform the patient of the risks associated with the use of opioids. The prescriber must also document the need for an opioid prescription in the patient's chart. The Assembly's Higher Education Committee will now consider the bill.



On Tuesday, the Kentucky Labor Cabinet announced the first meeting of the Kentucky Workers'

Compensation Regulatory
Advisory Committee on June
19. The Committee will be
responsible for the development
and implementation of a workers'
comp drug formulary by 2019
and treatment guidelines by
the end of 2018. The formulary
and treatment guidelines were
adopted by the legislature back in
March as part of HB 2.


This week, the National Institutes of Health **published** a list of objectives they will undertake to address the opioid epidemic after receiving \$500 million in research funds from the United States Congress. Among the objectives is tinkering with existing opioid medications so they can be taken less

often, discovering and validating new targets for non-addictive pain drugs, and partnering with pharmaceutical companies to accelerate the development of new pain and addiction medications.
