Step 1: Reflect on the Text

Why do we do this first? We always want to start with the Bible. The goal is to meditate on the Word and read it with an ear sensitive to the Holy Spirit's promptings. Look for words or phrases that stand out through logic, repetition, layout, etc.

Read the sermon scripture(s) listed above. What stood out to you? What do you find interesting and/or important? What is challenging or causes you to have questions?

Step 2: Reflect on the Sermon

- 1 How do people use the term "faith" in different ways? What is your default definition of "faith"?
- 2 What was your one main/big takeaway from the sermon? How would you summarize the main theme of the sermon in one phrase or sentence?

REAL FAITH RECEIVED

- 3 Surprising recipients. Who were the surprising recipients of faith in John 4? God delights to give faith to the foolish, the left out, the outsiders, the unpopular. Do you feel like you are in any of these categories? Do know someone in one of these categories?
- 4 *Sad resistance*. Who resisted Jesus in John 4? Growing up in the church, what is the difference between getting a weak strain of Christianity versus getting the real thing? Familiarity with the things of God can breed boredom has this ever been true for you?
