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maryvale's HISTORY

In 1856, five Daughters of Charity traveled from Maryland to Los Angeles to open the area's first orphanage. In 1953, Maryvale benefactress Carrie Estelle Doheny helped obtain land in Rosemead for what is now known as Maryvale. Over the years, Maryvale's evolution from an orphanage to an agency providing care for foster youth mirrors the development of the child welfare system in the United States as a whole.

daughters of CHARITY

The Daughters of Charity is an international community of Catholic women established in 1633 by St. Vincent de Paul and St. Louise de Marillac. Dedicated to serving "the poorest of the poor," today, the Daughters of Charity comprises more than 19,000 Catholic women who minister worldwide to the sick and the poor. Since 1856 Maryvale has Cared for orphaned, abused & neglected children, evolving into a social welfare organization, nurturing traumatized youth in the foster care system.

- Infant/Toddler care (birth-36 months)
- Preschool (3-5 years)
- Before- and after-school care (K-6th grade), Duarte

Maryvale empowers children and families by giving them the tools and support necessary to move from victims to survivors.

Maryvale's Trauma Informed Care approach relies on the understanding that everyone is doing the best they can, and collaborative problem solving will allow them to achieve their goals. Once they have the tools, our responsibility is to hold onto hope until they can do it for themselves.

Trauma Informed Care looks outside the box when working with those in crisis. Every person's individual needs must be examined and met in order for change to be achieved. At Maryvale, we ask "what do our children and families need in order to believe that relationships heal and that what they've been through isn't who they are, but what they can overcome."

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT PROGRAM

Maryvale cares for abused, abandoned and neglected children in the foster care and probation systems. With a comprehensive Trauma Informed Care treatment plan, Maryvale helps children in crisis begin to stabilize and heal.

RESIDENTIAL TREATMENT FOR GIRLS

Most girls in Maryvale's program, ages 13 to 18, have endured profound suffering. Some have been victims of sex trafficking and many have numerous failed placements in foster homes. The program helps girls heal from past trauma through intensive mental health services and care that addresses physical, emotional and sexual abuse.

EMERGENCY PLACEMENT CENTER

This short-term program provides critical medical, psychological and educational assessments for girls and boys, ages 6 to 12. The Center's evaluations assist social workers with finding longer term homes for some of the most difficult child trauma cases. By working with Maryvale's Trauma Informed Care staff, the children begin to strengthen and rebuild, emotionally and physically.

FAMILY RESOURCE CENTER

The Center provides mental health support for children and families in the San Gabriel Valley:

- Individual, family and group therapy
- Psychiatric consultation and medication management
- Parenting education, community resource referrals
- Birth to 5, including parent-child interaction therapy
- Child abuse prevention, intervention services

INTENSIVE SERVICES

WRAPAROUND SERVICES help children and families/caregivers involved with the Department of Children and Family Services and the Department of Probation. A facilitator, a child and family specialist, a parent partner and a clinician work closely together to provide the family with tailored mental health and support care.

FIELD CAPABLE CLINICAL SERVICES offers intensive services for at-risk youth/families provided in the home, school, or other community settings.
