





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

## Kids in the Spotlight

For five years, Maryvale has participated in the Kids in the Spotlight (KITS) filmmaking program. The 15-week program empowers foster children to grow through storytelling while learning all aspects of filmmaking where they collectively write scripts, cast, act, edit and work in production.

This year, one of the films our Maryvale girls created was a stark look at human trafficking and the devastation it causes to the child and the family.

"Trapped Within" was written by four of our residents, two of whom are survivors of sex trafficking.

The script's focus and raw truth were powerfully evident because the two writers had lived and survived its reality and had the courage to share their experiences. Their short film received the Jordan Award for Best Picture at this year's KITS 8th Annual Movies by Kids Film Festival.

A recent visit by a Maryvale alum from 1959 provided inspiration to our residents when she shared some of the transitions in her life. Jacki was a 14-year-old who was struggling emotionally as a result of difficult family circumstances. "Maryvale taught me to be accountable, and that was a good and loving thing. Maryvale is home to me. When I get in bad places

mentally, I go home."

She stressed that circumstances "don't make you." "You can be a victim, or you can choose to survive," she said. "There is life on the other side, and you can get there. I did."

During her visit, Jacki jots down inspirational notes to residents, at right. She continues to send letters to residents from afar, and encourages them to write back.





# Life Through Art

"Art helps get my feelings out when words fail," said former Maryvale resident Glorianna during a KPCC interview about her artwork. "I'm not gonna lie, it is really, really sad and I cried when I made it (a comic strip about the loss of her mother) because there's gonna be those days when everything is sad and people cry and that's OK," she shared. "When you draw something sad or to explain the way you are feeling, even if it's just colors on paper, sometimes you gotta use fingerpaints, sometimes you gotta splatter it everywhere. Sometimes you gotta rip up paper and then make something out of it on canvas."
