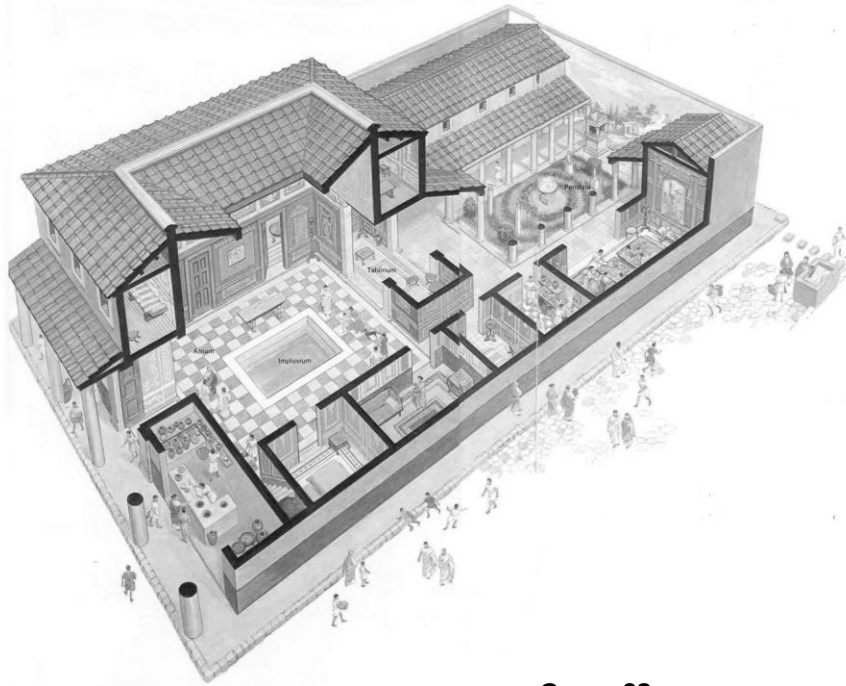


Resurrection in Corinth- Join a Small Group!



Christians in Corinth met in homes and public spaces to worship, pray, study, fellowship, and share the gospel. These small groups, based on home size, could grow beyond 60 people. These households were the focal points of strength and weakness in the Corinthian community.

As a “small group leader”, ask how each passage of the letters would apply specifically to the actual people in your group. Pray for the groups of people represented in your group.

The groups listed here distribute existing groups in the Corinthian community into household groups. Categories such as families, slaves, freedmen, the poor, unbelieving spouses, and children would likely be represented in every group.

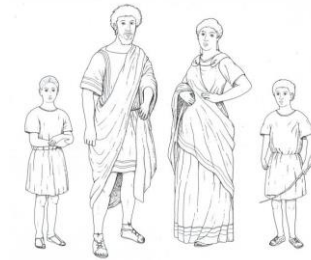
