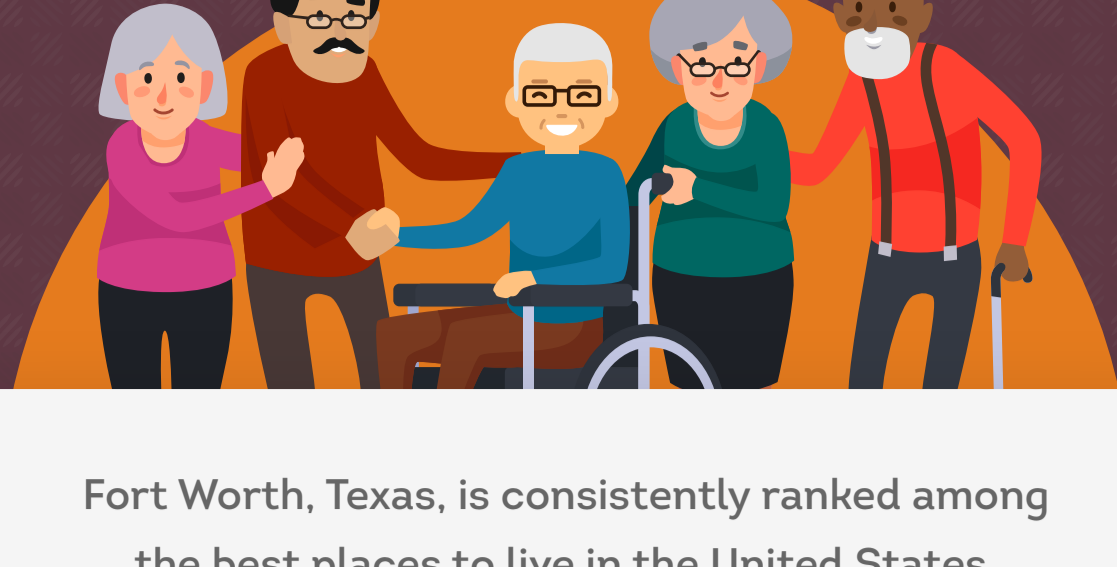
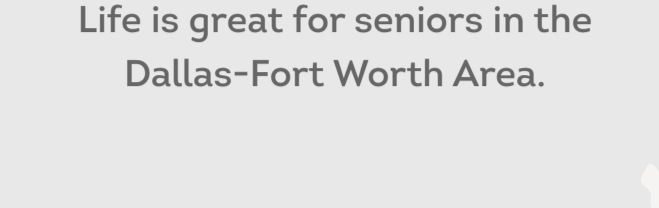
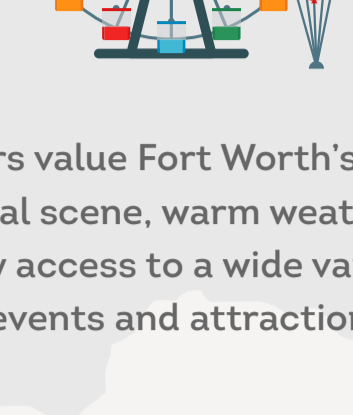


# Senior Living in Fort Worth, TX

The home of NASCAR and Indy Racing is a great place to get a low-risk adrenaline rush, whether you're 5 or 85.

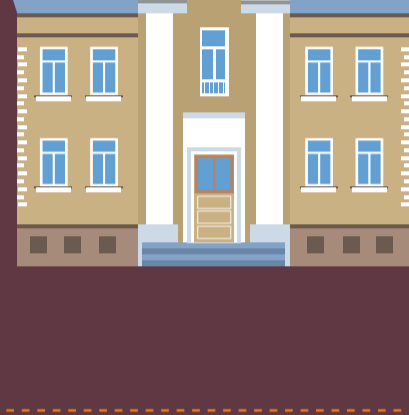
**Fort Worth Zoo**

### Fort Worth Stockyards

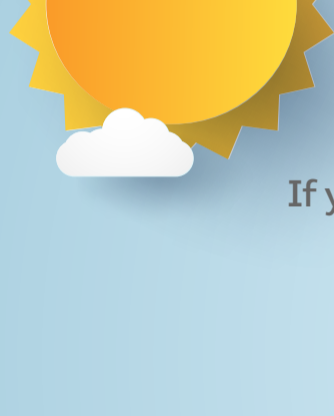

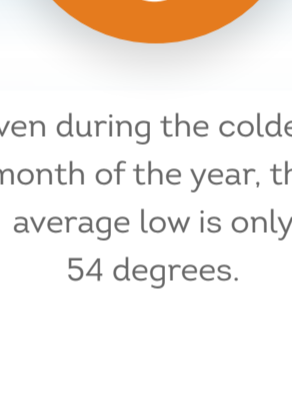
### Fort Worth Botanic Garden

Featuring tours, exhibits, classes, and a wide range of plants in every season, the Fort Worth Botanic Garden is the perfect stop for nature lovers.

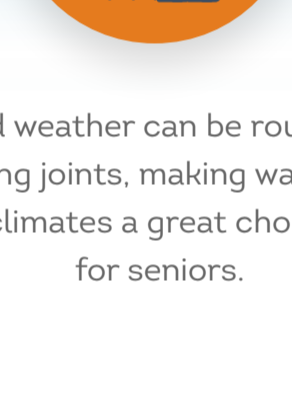


## WEATHER

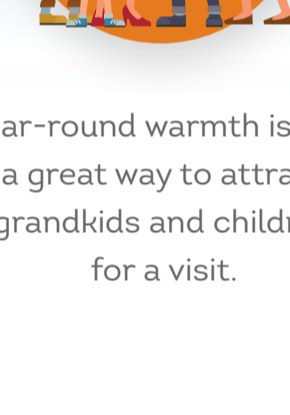
If you love warm weather, Fort Worth is the place for you.

### Texas Health Harris Methodist Hospital

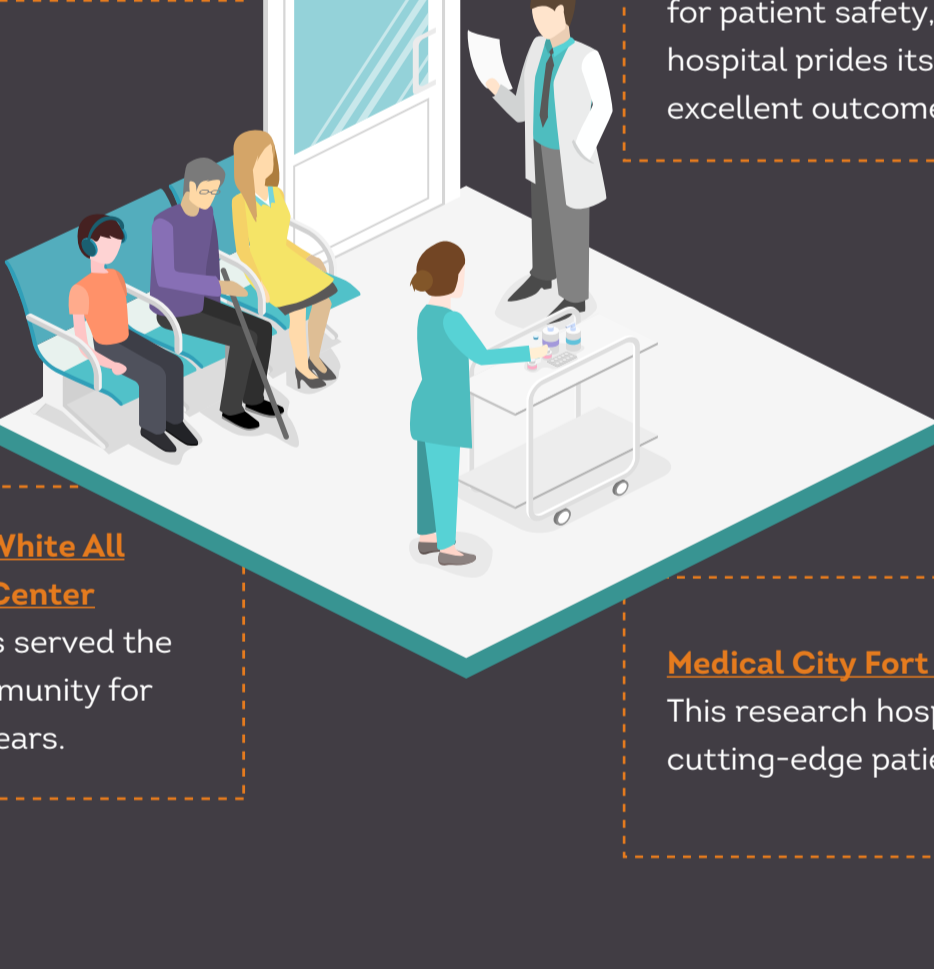
The recipient of an "A" grade for patient safety, this hospital prides itself on excellent outcomes.

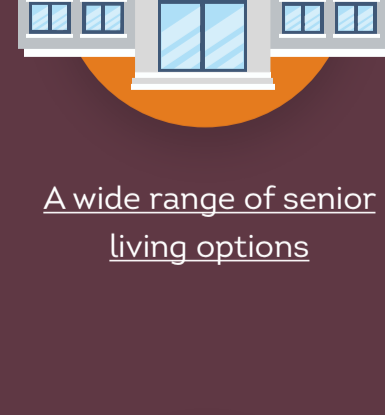
## RESOURCES FOR SENIORS

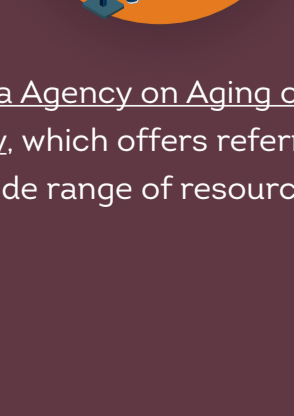
Fort Worth is also home to dozens of senior activity centers featuring activities such as yoga, dance classes, and support group meetings. Some other resources to explore include:
