Area Agency on Aging: Thorough list of resources and programs for older adults in Weld County. AAA offers a wide range of programs, both through their office as well as with community partners, that provide supportive services and opportunities for older and high-risk adults to enhance their health and maintain their independence. Adult Protective Services: Adult Protective Services (APS) receives reports of abuse, neglect and exploitation of at-risk adults, conducts an investigation into the allegations, and implements services to reduce and prevent further mistreatment. 970.346.7676.

Chore Service: The Chore Service program provides funds to older adults for chore services which they are unable to do themselves. The program is designed to increase safety of individuals living at home. Services may include deep cleaning the home, grass/weed cutting, snow removal, etc. 970.400.6130.

Dental, Vision, Hearing Financial assistance: The Dental, Vision and Hearing Program provides financial assistance to older adults in need of dental, vision and/or hearing aid services. These may include exams, extractions, dentures, frames and/or lenses, and hearing aids. 970.400.6629.

Family Caregiver Support: The Family Caregiver Support program offers support, resources and information to assist caregivers. This program offers adult day programs, in-home respite care, and out-home respite care. 970.400.6130.

Senior Nutrition Program - Friendly Fork: Friendly Fork provides nutritious and delicious lunches for older adults served at 23 sites throughout Weld County. See the AAA Help Source Directory for a full time of locations and times. 970.400.6132.

Long-Term Care Ombudsman: An Ombudsman is an advocate who protects civil and human rights of people in long term care facilities. They serve as a problem-solver and mediator; a resource and educator about long-term care; and an objective investigator of complaints and concerns in long-term care and assisted living facilities. 970.400.6128.



In-Home Services Program: The In-Home Services program provides financial assistance to older adults in need of homemaker or personal care assistance to remain in their homes and to live independently. Homemaker assistance may consist of meal preparation, shopping, light housework, money management or using the telephone. Personal care assistance could consist of bathing, dressing, walking, eating and other personal care activities. 970.400.6305.

Catholic Charities: Catholic Charities have case management for at-risk seniors 60+ to help them remain safe and independent. Advocacy, application assistance, home visits, information, referral, etc. 970.353.6433.

Hispanic Elderly Outreach, Fort Lupton: Hispanic Elderly Outreach of Fort Lupton has bilingual Case Managers assist Spanish-speaking older adults by connecting them to community resources. 303.857.0521.

Meals on Wheels: Meals on Wheel provides specially prepared, nutritious meals are delivered to the homes of seniors five days per week. 970.353.9738.

Colorado Legal Services: Colorado Legal Services assists seniors with public assistance benefits, preparation of living wills and powers of attorney, landlord or rent issues, senior housing and other personal rights issues. 970.353.7554.
