List of components and ideas for installation



12 Foundations Pencils (2"x16")

As seen in the ABL Lab manual (The 12 Foundations of Learning Readiness) These can be placed along the floor in any pattern with arrows in between. Each student when they arrive on a pencil they will have to perform the action that pertains to whatever foundation they land on. QTY:12



ABC Crayons (2"x10")

These fun alphabet crayons can be placed either on the floor or the wall to encourage learning the alphabet. They can be used to help coordinate words with letters, or colors. QTY:26



Paint Splatter Numbers (8"x7.5")

These big, colorful numbers can be placed either on the wall or the floor to encourage identification of numbers and colors. This is also fun in a hopscotch pattern. QTY: 10



Arrows (5"x5")

These are where the fun really is - there are plenty of arrows that allow you to place these along the path to direct your students which way to go. There are straight arrows, and then circle arrows, use these to let the students know they need to turn around! QTY: 31



Brushes & Palette (20"x18")

This brush set and palette gives a fun look and ties all of your art themed elements together! This can be used as a visual for learning colors or just to incorporate throughout.

Remember: since we want the kids to move and take full advantage of each element make sure to place them with enough space between to allow for movement!

APPLICATION INSTRUCTIONS

Step 1: Cut out each element

You will need to cut out each element around the outside of the decal.

Step 2: Clean the surface that you want to apply to very well and allow to dry

Step 3: Use a finger nail and separate the decal from the backing and slowly pull decal all the way off

Step 4: carefully lay one side of the decal down on the surface first and use a credit card or something similar to apply pressure to the decal and slowly work your way to the other end. As you are using your applicator you will need to pull the other side taught, to lessen the amount of possible air bubbles.

For the larger decals it is helpful to have someone help, that way one person can be pulling one side taught, while the other person is moving your applicator of choice and applying pressure to the decal.
