Simon Collins

Geological Services Manager and Senior Geotechnical Specialist at Aggregate Industries

"Design, Construction, Maintenance and Inspection of Embankment Dams (Quarry Lagoons) in the UK."

In this very informative presentation delivered at Tarmac's Birtley Office, Simon, an acknowledged specialist in the field of geotechnics, talked through the main issues that need to be taken into account in the design, construction and operation of quarry lagoons.

Simon based his talk on lagoons formed below ground and above ground embankment dams. He looked at the different types of construction and the common failure modes which need to be anticipated for each type, including slope failure, piping failure, overlapping, seismic induced failure (e.g. by quarry blasting) and rapid draw-down failure.

Simon was able to use his experience to provide guidance on a range of design specifications for dealing with particular situations. Much emphasis was also placed on regular monitoring and inspection of the lagoons, with Simon giving helpful advice on what to look out for, how to deal with particular defects and also on knowing when to seek help. The talk ended with much lively discussion on potential effects of blasting and on restoration of lagoons.

On the 7th June 2017 North East branch members visited the Health and Safety Laboratory at Buxton. It is a state of the art purpose built laboratory and the site covers an area of 550 acres employing about 320 scientific, technical and medical staff. HSL is one of the World's leaders in Health and Safety primarily focusing on the development of practical solutions to Workplace Health and Safety problems. After a cup of coffee and an informative briefing on the history and function of HSL we visited one of the main laboratories were PPE is rigorously tested and we were shown several samples of failed equipment and the impact of the failure.


Very sophisticated equipment was also demonstrated to us used for the testing of noise and respiratory PPE. We then visited the mechanical engineering laboratory which was very impressive and equipped with a multitude of heavy lifting and testing equipment. We were shown many examples of failed mechanical equipment and the facilities used in the laboratory to test and analyse reasons for equipment failure.

The final part of the visit was out in the field and we were shown several areas of accident reconstructions, eg. rail crashes, LPG explosions, fires in industrial buildings and tunnels. Everyone was amazed to see the effort put into reconstructing accident sites and rapidly appreciated why the site is so extensive and in such a remote area. The visit concluded with a buffet lunch and a vote of thanks to our hosts for such a well organised and informative visit.
