### One of the best feelings in life is that first time you turn the key, open the front door, and walk into a home you own yourself.

It is an empowering moment filled with excitement and anticipation for the good times to come.

This summer, Muktar and Esniya experienced that feeling as they brought their two young sons into their new home in Brooklyn Park. Our staff celebrated with them because they were the first family ever to partner with Twin Cities Habitat to buy a home on the open market (read their story

on the opposite page).

This new buying option for families is part of our audacious goal to multiply our impact and more than double Twin Cities Habitat homebuyers by 2020. Thankfully, our new partnership with Bremer Bank (the largest banking partnership in Habitat for Humanity history) will provide the funding for hundreds of affordable Habitat mortgages. But to ensure these mortgages stay affordable for families – and empower all those families to become homeowners – we must increase our philanthropic support by thirty percent.

Thirty percent more giving to more than double our homebuyers. That's good math and a smart investment; because buying a Habitat home is a multi-generational life-changing event for a family. I think of all the advantages Muktar and Esniya's boys will enjoy, starting with a safe place to play, grow, and learn.

The generosity of Twin Cities Habitat supporters like you never ceases to amaze me (our volunteers contributed more than 30,000 days in the past year!) so I know we will do this together. Please join me in digging a bit deeper so many more families can experience the joy of walking into homes they own for the very first time.
