

Your support impacts generations. You provide the firm foundation that gives local families the chance to write their own success stories—like Simone's.



A divorce left Simone's mom, Betty, struggling to make ends meet for her two daughters. They moved every few months in search of a stable, affordable place to live.



Betty partnered with Habitat in 1991. Working alongside volunteers she rehabbed and purchased her North Minneapolis home when Simone was nine.



The stability of Betty's home meant Simone could stay in one school and build strong friendships. She went on to earn a Master's degree in social work.

After years of careful planning and Her sister Lynnisha also bought a saving, Simone bought a home of her own. She and her four kids are now thriving in their North Minneapolis community.




