Program Manager

The program manager has overall responsibility and authority for delivering the program.

- Formulate, organize, and monitor inter-connected projects making up the program.
- Initiate and manage project teams through the entire lifespan of a project, from idea through launch, availability, and implementation of the program.
- Building and maintain integrated project schedule for all works streams of a program.
- Coordinate cross-project activities amongst cross-functional teams.
- Lead and evaluate project managers and other staff.
- Develop and control deadlines, budget, and activities.
- Apply change, risk, and resource management to program.
- Assume overall responsibility for program-assigned staff and vendors.
- Assess program performance through development and production and aim to maximize ROI.
- Govern and control scope of program.
- Prepare reports on overall program status.
- Identify risk, escalate appropriately, and manage resolution.
- Work closely with program’s executive leadership and multi-functional

leadership to ensure business goals are met.

- Work with SVP Publisher, VP Digital, Shared Services, VP subject area, and other responsible staff to complete program plans and roadmap complete program lifecycle.
- Work with business manager and department heads to ensure project remains on budget.
- Facilitate problem-solving with team members to ensure program's scope and goals are not compromised.
